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Background

The quarterly statistical report provides summary information on Income and Expenditure as well as total recipients of the main schemes administered by the Department of Social Protection.

The quarters referenced in this report cover the following periods

These statistics may be subject to revision and should be considered as provisional.

Figure 1: Expenditure (€m) by quarter





Figure 2: Social Insurance Fund Income and Expenditure (€m)

- The overall expenditure of the Department of Social Protection to end-March 2021 was €8.2 billion. This was €2.7 billion, or 48%, higher than the same period in 2020, and an increase of €126 million (2%) compared to Quarter 4 2020.
- Expenditure on Social Assistance schemes was an estimated €3.8 billion, an increase of 33% or €1 billion compared to the same period last year.
- Expenditure on schemes financed from the Social Insurance Fund was an estimated €4.4 billion, an increase of €1.7 billion or 64% compared to the same period last year. This increase is primarily related to the Pandemic Unemployment Payment and Enhanced Illness Benefit schemes.
- Social Insurance Fund income was estimated at €2.8 billion this quarter, €116 million lower than the same quarter last year. For that reason the Social Insurance Fund recorded a current account deficit of €1.6 billion for the first quarter of the year.
- On a 12-month rolling basis, from Quarter 2 2020 to Quarter 1 2021, total expenditure of the Department was estimated at €33.1 billion.







Programme Expenditure

- Working Age Income Support payments amounted to an estimated €2.6 billion in Quarter 1 2021, over €1.6 billion (175%) higher compared to the same period in 2020.
- Working Age Employment Support payments were estimated at €1.3 billion for this quarter, a year-on-year increase of €1.1 billion or 587%. This is due primarily to costs associated with the Employee Wage Subsidy Scheme.
- Spending on Illness, Disability and Carers payments was €33
 million lower compared to the same quarter last year, representing
 a year-on-year decrease of 2.9%.

- Child related payments also saw a slight annual decrease, with expenditure this quarter estimated at €665 million, compared to €672 million in Quarter 1 2020.
- Since the introduction of covid-related supports in March 2020, €12 billion has been paid on these supports to end-March 2021, of which €2.8 billion was expended in the first quarter of 2021.
- Estimated expenditure breakdown of the main Covid related supports for Quarter 1 2021 was as follows; Pandemic Unemployment Payment (€1.7 billion), Employment Wage Subsidy Scheme (€1.1 billion), and Enhanced Illness Benefit (€38 million).

Figure 3: Expenditure to date by Social Protection Programme (€): This period and same period last year











Pensions

- Some 677,367 people received payments across the main Pension schemes in Quarter 1 2021, an increase of 3% (18,281) compared to Quarter 1 2020.
- The State Pension Contributory (SPC) scheme recorded a 3.7% year-on-year growth in recipients, from 438,247 to 456,128, while there was minimal annual change in the number of recipients of the State Pension Non-Contributory (SPC) and Widow(er)'s Contributory Pension (WCP).
- Figure 4: Pension recipients by year and by scheme



- The mean rate of payment for all Pensions schemes was €248 per week. Across the schemes the average weekly payment was €254 for SPC, €232 for SPNC, and €259 for WCP.
- Around 59% of people on the SPC were male, while females accounted for 60% of SPNC recipients and 85% of WCP recipients.

Figure 5: Pension recipients this quarter by sex and by scheme








Working Age Income Supports


- A total of 570,492 people received at least one Pandemic Unemployment Payment (PUP) in Quarter 1 2021. This was 76,624 or 15%, higher than Quarter 4 2020, but down by 22% compared to the 734,259 people who received this payment in Quarter 2 2020.
- The average weekly payment was €303 for PUP, €223 for Jobseekers Allowance and €191 for Jobseekers Benefit in Quarter 1 2021.

- The total number of people in receipt of Jobseekers Benefit across Quarter 1 2021 was 55,594, an annual decrease of 18%, while the numbers availing of Jobseekers Allowance totalled 157,280, a 5% drop compared to one year previously.
- There were 29,501 recipients of Maternity Benefit and 6,544 recipients of Paternity Benefit in the quarter, while 6,675 people received payments from the Parents Benefit scheme.

Figure 7: Maternity, Paternity, and Parent's Benefit recipients






Illness, Disability, and Caring


- The number of people paid Illness Benefit in Quarter 1 2021 was 124,303, a rise of 14% from the previous quarter, and up by almost 24% when compared to Quarter 1 2020.
- Of those in receipt of Illness Benefit, 47,327 people received the Enhanced Illness Benefit (EIB) in the last quarter. This was an increase of 18,472 or 64% from the 28,855 people who received EIB in Quarter 4 2020.

- There were 155,601 people in receipt of Disability Allowance in the first quarter of 2021, an increase of 4,750 (3%) on the year before. The average weekly payment received on this scheme was €225.
- The total number of people receiving Carers payments in Quarter 1 2021 was 95,566, a rise of 3,628 (4%) from Quarter 1 2020. On average, Carer's Allowance recipients received a payment of €196, while Carer's Benefit recipients received a payment of €250.

Children and Supplementary Payments

- In the last quarter a total of 640,391 families received Child Benefit payments, down by 2,434 compared to Quarter 1 2020.
- Around 98% (630,153) of recipients of Child Benefit were female, while 2% (10,238) were male.
- Year-on-year, the number of people in receipt of the Working Family payment decreased by 12% to 50,322. The average payment for this scheme was €144.
- The number of recipients of Rent Supplement in Quarter 1 2021 totalled 20,872, a 26% increase (+4,373) compared to the first quarter of 2020.
- There were 200,524 recipients of the Household Benefits package in the quarter, representing a year-on-year increase of 26,243 or 15%.

Figure 10: Annual change (%) in Rent Supplement recipients by county



Notes

Methodology and quality considerations

The expenditure details in this report are based on estimates. The finalised expenditure information can be viewed in the latest Appropriation Accounts for Vote 37¹, or the latest Annual Statistics Report². Note that the estimated expenditure figures in this report may not add up exactly due to rounding.

When comparing to a previous quarter or previous year, the comparison can sometimes be impacted by the number of pay days that fall in a particular quarter. This may account for skews in expenditure and/or recipient totals in certain quarter periods.

The recipient totals were extracted from the Department's administrative systems, and include people who were issued at least one payment for a particular scheme in a given quarter. In the majority of cases the date in which the payment was made reflects the entitlement period .i.e. when the payment was issued the recipient's claim was open. However payments can be issued in respect to different entitlement periods (arrears payments). The figures produced in this report are calculated with reference to the date the payment was issued, and are therefore inclusive of arrears payments.

A person can be in receipt of payment for more than one scheme. All payments are inclusive of additional allowances such as the Christmas Bonus, Household Benefits, and payments for qualified adult or qualified child dependents.

The recipient figures quoted in the Annual Statistics report are not directly comparable to the numbers shown in this publication. The Annual Statistics report counts only those awarded and in receipt of payment at a point in time (December 31st) to ensure comparability with a series of statistical reports dating back to 1983.

Glossary of Terms

Recipient: A person actually receiving a Social Welfare payment

Social Assistance: payments funded from voted expenditure, which cover people who do not have sufficient PRSI contributions to qualify for the equivalent social insurance payments, or where entitlement to the social insurance payment has expired. These payments are typically means-tested.

Social Insurance Fund: a current account and an investment account managed by the Minister for Social Protection and the Minister for Finance, respectively. The current account consists of monies collected from people in employment, self-employment, and employer contributions. This money is then used to fund social insurance payments.

Open Data

Revisions

Revisions may occur as a result of changes in methodology, an update to a series or errors in the original data. Any significant revisions will be footnoted in the report and will describe the reason for the change and its impact on comparability (.i.e. with other schemes or over time).
