

# Marine Notice No. 33 of 2021

Notice to all Shipowners, Fishing Vessel Owners, Agents, Shipmasters, Skippers, Fishers, Yachtsmen and Seafarers

# Geophysical Survey Activity Off the South Coast of Ireland

## 1. Notice of Activity

The Department of Transport has been advised that Green Rebel Marine intends to conduct geophysical survey operations off the South Coast of Ireland. Operations will be conducted over an extended period of time, up to 1 year stretching from 3 June 2021 to approximately the 3 June 2022.

#### 2. Location of Activity

The survey will take place in the locations provided below:

#### 3. Details of the Survey Vessels

The survey will be conducted by two vessels; the "**Roman Rebel**", a Semi-SWATH catamaran (call sign: **2ICA5**) which will conduct 24-hr operations, and the "**Lady Kathleen**", a catamaran (call sign: **EIXT2**) which will conduct 12-hr operations. Both vessels will display appropriate lights and signals.

The geophysical survey will use a multibeam echosounder, sub-bottom profilers, side-scan sonars, and magnetometers. The multibeam and sub-bottom profiling systems will be hull mounted. The side-scan sonars and magnetometers will be towed using dedicated winches at cable lengths dictated by the water depth. Typically, the cable lengths will be about four times the water depth while acquiring data.

Please all note survey operations are weather dependent.
