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The Report recommends a centralised, operational model for Ireland. Do you agree with this recommendation? Yes, a dedicated, legislative underpinned centralised model is the only way to start off this scheme.

Are there other models you believe could work in an Irish context? Not as a starting point.

What role should waste collectors play in the operation of a DRS? They should be a communication point for the system given their networks of customers.

- The DRS study proposes a deposit per container of €0.20. Do you think this is appropriate? If not should it be higher or lower or should different deposit rates apply depending on container size? .20 is good as a starting point
- Consumers need to know about a DRS long before it becomes operational – do you have any suggestions as to how best the introduction of a DRS can be communicated to the public? It needs to be utilised in social media across all ages, including direct contact from local authorities and waste companies. Introducing the system through schools and sporting clubs and any body that receives public funding would hit a large amount of people very quickly.
- What enforcement measures should be considered in parallel with the introduction of a DRS? as determined by the Oireachtas, so that it can be strengthened under Ministerial order faster.
