As a regular Dodder walker, I can vouch that bottles and cans are the most significant litter issue on the Dodder banks between Milltown and Clonskeagh. Walking from Farmer Browns to the Dropping Well on two days I got 16 and 24 bottles and cans on the two days and 29 and 2 coffee cups on the paths beside the Dodder. There are nests of bottles and cans in the bushes.

This is an avoidable problem which is destroying the local environment and counter-arguments from Repak only work when the impact of litter and the cost of litter management are excluded from the reckoning. But this is the main cost.
