Brief guide to 2022 Areas of Natural Constraints (ANC) Scheme

Please familiarise yourself fully with the Terms and Conditions of the Scheme before completing your Application Form as the onus will be on you, the applicant(s), to comply fully with them in order to qualify for payment. Key points from Terms and Conditions 2022

- ❖ Applications for the scheme (previously the Disadvantaged Areas Scheme) must be made using the Basic Payment Online Application System by ticking the appropriate box on the Online Application at www.agfood.ie
- ❖ Please note you must tick the box, located under the heading of "Other Schemes and Activities" to confirm that you wish to apply for payment under the Areas of Natural Constraints Scheme. In the event you have no land changes to declare in your 2022 BPS application, it will still be necessary to tick the box to apply for the Areas of Natural Constraints (ANC) scheme in 2022.
- **❖** Failure to tick this box will mean that you will not be eligible for payment under the ANC scheme in 2022.

❖ All applications must be submitted by **midnight on 16 May 2022.**

To qualify for the ANC/ASC Scheme you must:

- ❖ Hold a valid herd number, or have applied to the Local District Veterinary Office for a herd number, on or before 16th May 2022, and farm eligible disadvantaged lands in your own right.
- ❖ Maintain a minimum stocking density of 0.15 livestock units per eligible forage hectare for 7 consecutive months within the 2021 calendar year and maintain an annual average stocking density of 0.15 livestock units per eligible forage hectare for the 2021 calendar year.

With regards to specific stocking requirements, please note the following:

- ❖ Please note that with effect from the 2022 scheme year, in accordance with a determination of the European Court of Auditors, the minimum stocking density requirements will be calculated on the total maximum eligible area available to applicants, rather than on their claimed area.
- ❖ This may result in an increased stocking requirement for some applicants whose maximum eligible area is greater than their total claimed area.
- ❖ Applicants are therefore urged to review their stocking levels to ensure they meet the minimum required stocking density.
- ❖ Cattle, sheep, horses, donkeys, goats and deer are animals which are eligible to satisfy stocking requirements. Donkeys can only account for 50% of stocking density requirements. Applicants with donkeys only will need additional animals from one of the other eligible animal types to satisfy the remaining 50% requirement.
- ❖ Applicants with sheep and/or goats must have submitted a valid Sheep/Goat Census return within the specified timelines.
- ❖ In cases where it is necessary to submit your flock register for sheep and goats, the Original Flock/Goat Register must be submitted certified copies will not be accepted.
- ❖ With effect from the 2022 Scheme year, applicants seeking to fulfil stocking density using either Horses or Donkeys <u>must submit certified copies of the equine passports</u> to the ANC section in Portlaoise. Certified copies of the passports should only be submitted after the minimum seven month retention period and annual total has been met, i.e. after the 31st July 2022.
- ❖ For the purposes of the ANC scheme, equine passports can be certified by a recognised Agricultural Agent, a practising Solicitor or Commissioner for Oaths or a member of An Garda Siochána.

- ❖ In the case of equines, specific requirements concerning breeding enterprise criteria and equine age apply. Please consult Section 7 of the ANC terms and conditions document entitled Stocking Requirements for further information
- ❖ In the case of new entrants, applicants are required to meet the minimum required stocking density within 10 working days of receiving their herd number.
- ❖ Where a holding has been restricted due to the presence of an animal disease (e.g. TB) applicants are required to meet the minimum required stocking density within 20 working days of derestriction.

To start your BPS application -click 'Start Application'





Applicant details screen




The next screen will ask you to click buttons to choose the type of BPS application you wish to submit i.e. No Land Changes or I have Land Changes
