



Removal of COVID-19 Travel Restrictions

Marine Notice No. 15 of 2022

This Marine Notice is being issued on behalf of the Department of Health to inform industry of changes to COVID-19 travel restrictions in Ireland.

With effect from 00:01am on Sunday 6 March 2022, the COVID-19 travel requirements set out in S.I. No. 45 of 2021 and S.I. No. 135 of 2021 have been revoked by the Department of Health.

This means that there is **no longer** a requirement for any person travelling to Ireland to have:

- a completed passenger locator form;
- evidence of having been fully vaccinated;
- evidence of recovery from COVID-19; or
- evidence of a negative/not-detected result from a RT-PCR/Antigen test.

The Department requests that all Port Authorities take note of this change and remove any signage associated with such requirements. Passenger ferries are also requested to remove any signage related to the above restrictions from on board vessels, to update their websites accordingly and to advise passengers scheduled to travel in the short term of the changes to travel requirements.
