Below please see submission in relation to the Wild Salmon and Sea Trout Tagging Scheme Regulations 2021, to provide for the management of the wild salmon and sea trout fishery by Inland Fisheries Ireland from 1st January 2022.

Dear Minister Ryan,

I am writing to appeal to you to adjust the opening day for angling on the river Slaney to the date of 1st March 2022 as proposed by the Slaney Rivers Trust. The Slaney is known to have a significant run of early spring Salmon and having legitimate anglers on the river as early as possible will assist with the protection of the Salmon run thave witnessed appalling levels of illegal poaching on the river in recent years. Anglers are vitally important caretakers of the river Slaney and its fish and have proven to be of great help to IFI with countering illegal poaching and pollution.

Recent studies by Irish fisheries scientists ( all all) have demonstrated that catch and release angling has little to no impact on fish mortality. This is especially the case in the higher flows and colder water temperatures of Spring.

As a professional game angling instructor and conservationist, I have more than a keen interest in playing my part in maintaining an abundance of Salmon in this wonderful river.
