Part II: Certification

Health Information

I, the undersigned official veterinarian, hereby certify that the animals described in this certificate meet the following veterinary requirements:

- 1. Ireland has put in place a cattle tracing system (CTS) of identification of all cattle, their registration and their movement from birth to death, allowing to trace back the dam and the herd of origin.
- 2. Ireland is officially free, for more than twelve (12) months, from Foot And Mouth Disease, Vesicular Stomatitis, Rinderpest, Peste des Petits Ruminants, Contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia, Lumpy Skin Disease, Rift Valley Fever, Bluetongue, Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease, Bovine Brucellosis and Enzootic Bovine Leukosis and vaccination against these diseases was not practised during the same period.
- 3. Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy:
 - a. Ireland is carrying out an epidemiological program for BSE eradication and surveillance in accordance with the OIE recommendations.
 - b. In case of BSE suspicion, all cattle movements are prohibited for the concerned herd.
 - c. The infected animal and the cohort of animals at risk are fully destroyed and incinerated when a confirmed BSE case occurs.
 - d. The use of mammalian proteins (except from milk, milk-based products and colostrum, eggs and egg products, gelatine derived from non-ruminants, fishmeal where they are used for the production of milk replacers used solely in the feeding of young ruminants) is forbidden for feeding ruminants.
- 4. Ireland implements every year a national survey plan for investigation of residues of veterinary drugs, growth promoters and environmental contaminants in meat.
- 5. The use of anabolic or hormonal growth promoters is forbidden for feeding ruminants.
- 6. The exported animals come from herds free from brucellosis without vaccination in accordance with the Terrestrial Animal Health Code (Ireland is free from Brucellosis The animals to be exported are derived from herds which satisfy the requirements of Article 8.4.10 of Chapter 8.4 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code and the individual animals satisfy the requirements of Article 8.4.4; paragraphs 1,2 and 3 [were kept in a country free from bovine brucellosis])
- 7. The exported animals come from herds free from enzootic bovine leucosis without vaccination in accordance with the Terrestrial Animal Health Code (Ireland is free from Leukosis- The animals to be exported meet the requirements of Chapter 11.11 Article 11.11.4 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code [come from a country free of EBL])
- 8. The exported animals come from herds free from bovine tuberculosis in accordance with the Terrestrial Animal Health Code

The animals were born in herds free from tuberculosis in accordance with the Terrestrial Animal Health Code and were subjected with negative results to a tuberculin intradermal comparative test with negative results during the 30 days prior to shipment.

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- 9. The exported animals are not to be killed under a national eradication program of contagious diseases.
- 10. Ireland is free from Bluetongue.
- 11. Animals and the means in which they are transported were treated with authorised insecticides persistent during the transportation from their farm of origin and at the time of shipment to Jordan after adequate cleansing and disinfection.

- 12. They show no clinical evidence of any contagious disease at the time of loading.
- 13. All exported animals have an individual identification number and are accompanied by the copy of the original identification card permitting tracing their origin.
