My name is a second of a m from, and living in, Dublin.

My view is that a 51% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 is a bare minimum, and an even bigger reduction should be made if possible, and I think that climate neutrality should be achieved earlier than 2050, perhaps as early as 2040. This is because the climate crisis is a serious and urgent global emergency, and it is easily the biggest worry I have right now. I am also aware that making Ireland climate neutral by 2040 will probably put our economy in bad shape until it is made fully climate neutral, but I am certain that failing to become climate neutral before it's too late will put our economy into much worse shape, and it will take much longer to recover, if it will ever recover at all.

So it is for this reasons that I request that Ireland adopts a more ambitious carbon budget, and sticks to it.
