Offshore Wind Grid Delivery Model Option Consultation

It seems that the Irish Government has regrettably already decided to go ahead with a plan to develop wind energy at sea through the use of wind turbines and that this public consultation is to decide which of four types to use.

This public consultation should be about whether wind energy from turbines at sea is economically viable or environmentally damaging to marine wildlife such as fish, cetaceans, seabirds etc. Wind turbines on land and especially at sea are not economically viable as they do not produce enough energy to make a profit, they also require high and costly maintenance, are susceptible to damage from storms at sea.
