

Marine Notice No. 58 of 2022

Notice to all Shipowners, Fishing Vessel Owners, Agents, Shipmasters, Skippers, Fishers, Yachtsmen and Seafarers

Arklow Bank Wind Park Geophysical Survey off the Wicklow Coast

1. Notice of Activity

The Department of Transport has been advised that a geophysical survey will be undertaken in the Irish Sea (off the Wicklow coast) to provide site investigation information to facilitate the development of the Arklow Bank Wind Park. The survey work is anticipated to start at the end of August **2022** and be completed by the **end of October 2022**. All operations are weather dependent.

2. Location of Activity

The survey campaign will be confined to the proposed Arklow Bank Phase 2 Wind Park. The Arklow Bank area is located approx. 3nm to 7nm off the coast of County Wicklow consisting of a north-south trending sandbank around 12nm in length and sub-parallel to the coastline between Ardmore point and Kilmichael point.

The working area of operations will be at the coordinates indicated in the table below. The survey area is bounded by the following points as shown in Appendix 1.

3. Details of Vessels

The operations will be conducted by the following vessels:

- "Roman Rebel" (call sign 2ICA5)
- "Lady Kathleen" (Call sign EIXT2).

As the survey vessels will be restricted in their ability to manoeuvre when surveying, due to the deployment of the towed survey equipment from the vessel for the duration of the survey activities, all vessels operating within this area are requested to keep their distance and pass at minimum speed to reduce vessel wash. The work will be conducted during 24 hr operations on board the "Roman Rebel" and 12 hr operations on board the "Lady Kathleen". Mariners are advised to keep continuous watch on VHF radio channel 16 when navigating the area. The vessels will display appropriate lights and signals.
