

Marine Notice No. 60 of 2022

Notice to all Shipowners, Fishing Vessel Owners, Agents, Shipmasters, Skippers, Fishers, Yachtsmen and Seafarers

Inis Ealga Marine Energy Park geophysical site survey campaign off counties Cork and Waterford

1. Notice of Activity

The Department of Transport has been advised that DP Energy Ireland Ltd intend to undertake geophysical surveys at the proposed Inis Ealga Marine Energy Park off counties Cork and Waterford beginning on 2 **September 2022**. It is anticipated that the survey works will take 5 days, subject to weather. All surveys will be undertaken outside of 12 Nautical Miles.

2. Location of Activity

The operations will take place at the locations indicated in the table below. Further information on the locations is available in the map at Appendix 1.

3. Details of the Survey Vessel

The ILV **Granuaile** (Call sign **EIPT**) will undertake the geophysical site survey campaign. The reconnaissance geophysical survey will be undertaken by running widely spaced lines across the array investigation area. The survey work will be performed using a hull mounted

multibeam echosounder (MBES) and towed seismic system (maximum towed length 60m). The vessel will conduct 24-hr operations (weather dependant). During operations, the vessel will be restricted in its ability to manoeuvre and will display appropriate shapes and lights. All vessels operating within this area are requested to keep their distance and pass at a minimum speed to reduce vessel wash. Communication on marine band radio frequencies Channel 16 will be conducted with other ships and vessels to notify them of the operations.
