1. Minutes of ESEG meeting on 20 July and actions arising

Meeting minutes were agreed by the Group. DECC have been asked to provide a Memo to Government which is in train. Updates were taken as complete except for those which will be covered in the course of the meeting.

2. Overview

The Chair gave an overview of the increasing concern at political level in relation to the impacts (price and security) of the war in Ukraine on the energy system and the need to enhance emergency planning, support measures and communications in advance of the coming winter.

3. Winter 2022/23 outlook

Gas outlook for winter: Dennis O'Sullivan noted that markets remain volatile due to Nord Stream 1 being shut off. It was noted that storage is approaching 80% full across Europe which reduces the risk for the coming winter but will be challenging to fill for the following winter. While futures prices are very high – the vast majority being traded is spot prices and there's a reluctance to buy gas for 2024. Forward prices are seen as a worst-case scenario.

Electricity outlook for winter: Rodney Doyle noted the winter outlook is as previously set out with generation availability being a key factor. If there are shortages there may be a need to import from the UK however their capacity may be tight this winter and there is a possibility of system alerts. EirGrid's Winter Outlook is due to be published in the coming weeks.

Gas and electricity emergency planning: Matt Collins updated on the forthcoming electricity and gas emergency exercise which will look at the effect of a prolonged gas supply reduction. First day is on the 9 September which will involve preparation and day two (16 September) will be a full exercise.



Retail prices: Aoife MacEvilly discussed a presentation on retail prices (circulated in advance of the meeting to the group). She noted electricity suppliers are likely to increase prices on 01 October for the rest of the year and average bills will likely be €2,000 to €2,500 per annum. This may rise to €3,000 in Q1 2023.
