At a recent meeting of the Carrigaline Municipal District in County Cork, Clir. Marcia D'Alton raised the following motion:



Dear Municipal District Council,

I write on behalf of Minister for the Environment, Climate and Communications, Éamon Ryan, in reply to your correspondence of February 19<sup>th</sup>, calling for Crosshaven to be included in the next review of Low Smoke Zones

It is not the intention of this Department to Introduce any further incremental extensions of the marketing, sale, distribution and burning of bituminous coal ("the smoky coal ban") to additional towns. Instead, in line with the commitment given in the Programme for Government, we are working towards a full nationwide extension of the ban.

Minister Ryan has taken the first step towards achieving this by launching a public consultation to seek views in relation to the national application of the regulations currently applied to bituminous coal, as well as informing the development of appropriate regulatory controls for other residential solid fuels. This is an opportunity for all parties to consider the issues, input to the process at the earliest stage, and to consider alternatives as appropriate, as we take the actions required to achieve our ambition of cleaner air across all of Ireland.
