Notice to all Shipowners, Fishing Vessel Owners, Agents, Shipmasters, Skippers, Fishers, Yachtsmen and Seafarers

Mac Lir Offshore Wind Farm – Geophysical Reconnaissance Survey

1. Notice of Activity

The Department of Transport has been advised that Mac Lir Offshore Wind Limited (MLOWL), a subsidiary company of Source Galileo Limited ('Source Galileo'), intends to undertake a geophysical reconnaissance survey within an area of survey off the coast of counties Wicklow and Wexford. The survey is expected to commence on **12 March 2023** and to be completed by **10 April 2023**, subject to weather and operational constraints.

The purpose of the survey is to undertake a reconnaissance geophysical survey across an area of surveys that may be suitable for the development of an offshore wind farm, the proposed Mac Lir Offshore Wind Farm (MLOWF). The survey will be undertaken by running widely spaced lines across the planned area of survey. The survey work will be performed using a hull-mounted multibeam echosounder (MBES), sub-bottom profilers, side-scan sonar, magnetometer, and towed Ultra High-Resolution Survey (UHRS) system (maximum towed length 500m).

2. Locations of proposed Activity

The survey campaign will be confined to the area of survey, the proposed MLOWF. The approximate location of these works is given in the map in Appendix 1 and in the table below. This area spans approximately 30 km north-south and 9 km east-west at its widest point.

3. Details of the Survey Vessels

The geophysical reconnaissance survey work will be conducted by the **R.V.** *Tom Crean* (Call sign: **EIYX3**), a multi-purpose marine research vessel. The vessel will conduct 24-hr operations (weather dependent). During operations, the vessel will be restricted in its ability to manoeuvre. All vessels operating within the planned area of survey are requested to keep their distance and pass at a minimum speed to reduce vessel wash. The vessel will display appropriate shapes and lights. Communication on marine band radio frequencies Channel 16 will be conducted with other ships and vessels to notify them of the operations.
