Background

This is the third annual report on the implementation of the actions in the <u>National Strategy</u> on <u>Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, 2015-2020</u>. Guided and influenced by the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights, the strategy is primarily aimed at children and young people under the age of 18, but also embraces the voice of young people in the transition to adulthood.

The four priorities of the National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, 2015-2020 are that:

- **1.** Children and young people will have a voice in decisions made in their local communities.
- **2.** Children and young people will have a voice in decision-making in early education, schools and the wider formal and non-formal education systems.
- **3.** Children and young people will have a voice in decisions that affect their health and well-being, including on the health and social services delivered to them.
- **4.** Children and young people will have a voice in the Courts and legal system.

The strategy contains a series of additional objectives, which include:

- **5.** Promoting effective leadership to champion and promote participation of children and young people.
- **6.** Development of education and training for professionals working with and on behalf of children and young people.
- **7.** Mainstreaming the participation of children and young people in the development of policy, legislation and research.

The actions outlined in the strategy aim to address the challenges that exist in children and young people being enabled to participate appropriately in decision-making.

The commitments outlined in this Action Plan for the National Strategy are aligned with Government commitments in, and based on the values, principles and vision of, <u>Better Outcomes</u>, <u>Brighter Futures</u>. All commitments and actions in this strategy are underpinned by the following key fundamentals:

- Recognition that children and young people have a right to participate in decisions that affect their lives;
- Ensuring the protection and welfare of children and young people in accordance with Children First;
- Establishing and improving mechanisms to ensure the participation of seldom-heard and vulnerable children and young people in decision-making;
- Collection of data, monitoring and evaluation of children and young people's participation initiatives.

The commitments in this Action Plan are the agreed actions for 2018. Additional commitments will be discussed and agreed upon for 2019 and 2020, which will be circulated and published for each of the final 2 years of the Strategy. This Third Action Plan Update

presents the progress made by all Government Departments and Agencies to implement the agreed actions in the Strategy to date.

The <u>first</u> and <u>second</u> annual reports on the implementation on the actions in the *National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, 2015-2020* were published in July 2016 and November 2017, respectively.

Defining Participation

Children and young people's participation in decision-making is defined as 'the process by which children and young people have active involvement and real influence in decision-making on matters affecting their lives, both directly and indirectly'. This definition is consistent with Article 12 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), which underlies this strategy, and Article 24 of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights.

According to the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child (the expert body that monitors implementation of the UNCRC) and in line with its General Comment on Article 12 of the UNCRC, the duty to take account of what children say applies in a variety of contexts. For example, at macro level, children's views should be taken into account in the development of national policies and in the design of services. At micro level, children's views should be taken into account in the individual decision-making that affects their daily lives. The UN Committee has highlighted the relevance of children's involvement in decision-making in schools and local communities, given that these are the spaces where many important decisions are taken that directly affect their lives. These are two of the priorities of the present strategy.

The participation of children and young people in decision-making involves taking children and young people seriously and where possible responding to their suggestions, ideas and views in an appropriate and timely manner.

Lundy's Model of Participation

The present strategy is underpinned by Lundy's Model of Participation (see Figure 2), which is grounded in the UNCRC and focused on a rights-based approach to involving children in decision-making.

Principles of Participation

The present strategy has adopted the principles of the Council of Europe's 2012 Recommendation on participation in decision-making of children and young people under the age of 18 and Article 12 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The principles refer to both the context for participation and the process of participation:

- There is no age limit on the right of the child or young person to express her or his views freely. All children and young people, including those of pre-school age, school age and those who have left full-time education, have a right to be heard in all matters affecting them, their views being given due weight in accordance with their age and maturity.
- The right of children and young people to participate applies without discrimination on any grounds, such as race, ethnicity, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, disability, birth, sexual orientation or other status.
- Consideration needs to be given to the notion of the evolving capacities of children and young people. As children and young people acquire more capacities, adults should encourage them to enjoy, to an increasing degree, their right to influence matters affecting them.
- Particular efforts should be made to enable participation of children and young people with fewer opportunities, including those who are vulnerable or affected by discrimination, including multiple discrimination.
- Parents and carers have the primary responsibility for the upbringing and the development of the child and, as such, play a fundamental role in affirming and nurturing the child's right to participate, from birth onwards.
- In order to be able to participate meaningfully and genuinely, children and young people should be provided with all relevant information and offered adequate support for self-advocacy appropriate to their age and circumstances.
- If participation is to be effective, meaningful and sustainable, it needs to be understood as a process and not a one-off event, and requires ongoing commitment in terms of time and resources.
- Children and young people who exercise their right to freely express their views must be protected from harm, including intimidation, reprisals, victimisation and violation of their right to privacy.
- Children and young people should always be fully informed of the scope of their participation, including the limitations on their involvement, the expected and actual outcomes of their participation, and how their views were ultimately considered.
- In line with the General Comment on Article 12 of the UNCRC, all processes in which children and young people are heard should be transparent and informative, voluntary, respectful, relevant to children's lives, in child-friendly environments, inclusive (non-discriminatory), supported by training, safe and sensitive to risk, and accountable. Member States should integrate these requirements into all legislative and other measures for the implementation of this recommendation.

Summary Finding of the Year 3 Report

Third Annual Report shows a positive picture of how the *National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, 2015-2020* continues to be implemented. The report findings show that 93% of the agreed actions have reached completion or are in progress All Government Departments and Agencies are actively progressing 68 of the 73 agreed actions for 2018.

DCYA role in leading delivery of the *National Strategy on Children and Young People's*Participation in Decision Making 2015 - 2020

Throughout Year 3 implementation, Department of Children and Youth Affairs continues to play an important role in leading Government efforts to ensure that children and young people have a voice in decisions that affect their lives.

The Participation Team within DCYA works across local and national Government to build, develop and sustain structures and processes which enable high quality participation opportunities for children and young people with a particular focus on ensuring seldom heard young people are included. Key deliverables during Year 3 implementation include:

- Comhairle na nÓg continues to thrive in all local authorities with the support of the
 Comhairle na nÓg Development Fund
- Comhairle na nÓg National Executive published and launched the 'How was school today?' research with the Ministers for Children and Youth Affairs and Education and Skills and has left an important resource for education policy makers
- Dáil na nÓg in December 2017 focused on the topic of equality and the current
 Comhairle na nÓg National Executive are working on a number of initiatives under this topic relevant to the school setting which will come to completion within 2019.

DCYA has also established a network of contact points from Government Departments and State Bodies with commitments in the Strategy to improve engagement and maintain focus on the priority actions. The network met twice during 2018 and will continue to meet over 2019.

At the end of Year 3 implementation, DCYA commenced a process of a mid-term review of implementation of the *National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision Making 2015 – 2020* and development of a cross Government Action Plan for Years 4 and 5 to take account of the lessons learned during the first 3 years implementation. This process will be completed in early 2019 and will lead to the publication of a 2 year action plan to complete implementation of the current strategy.

Hub na nÓg: Young Voices in Decision Making

Hub na nÓg was launched in November 2017 as a centre of excellence to support Government Departments, State Agencies and non-government organisations to give children and young people a voice on decisions that affect their lives, with a focus on seldom-heard children and young people¹. The name and brand for the Hub were developed through a consultation process with young people and adult stakeholders.

As part of its role in driving implementation of the *National Strategy on Children and Young* **People's Participation in Decision Making 2015 - 2020**, Hub na nÓg has progressed a number of key actions to support Government Departments and Agencies in their work under the Strategy throughout 2018.

Training: Hub na nÓg developed and delivered training in collaboration with

- (1) Sport Ireland for five national sporting bodies and organisations
- (2) The Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) to develop participation methods for use in the inspection process
- (3) The Arts Council for Creative Associates appointed to support the Creative Schools Initiative, which is part of the Creative Ireland Programme of the Department of Culture Heritage and the Gaeltacht.

Consultations: Hub na nÓg collaborated on the development and conducting of a number of consultations with children and young people in 2018, including consultations on:

- (1) the Strategic Plan for the Heritage Council
- (2) the **Cruinniú na nÓg** programme
- (3) Oberstown Standards
- (4) on the voice of the child in Adoption proceedings
- (5) on a change process for the **Garda Youth Diversion Programme**.

Since its inception, the Hub has been working with Professor Laura Lundy on co-producing a series of frameworks, including national standards, a planning framework, evaluation frameworks and a child-friendly evaluation form, influenced by the extensive child participation practice of the DCYA and Hub na nÓg. A paper on the impact of child participation on policy, service delivery and practice for the CRINI (Children's Research Network) Digest has also been published by the Hub.

1 Hub Objectives

^{1.} Become a key driver in supporting implementation of commitments in the National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, (2015 -2020) and Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures (BOBF) by collaborating with Government Departments and Agencies in conducting consultations with children and young people and by providing information, guidance, training and practical support.

Develop, document and disseminate innovative international best practice on children and young people's participation in decision-making.

Form partnerships with third-level and adult education institutions to oversee development of education on the right of children to a voice in the context of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, for professionals who work with and on behalf of children and young people.

Compiling the Third Action Plan Update

Compiling the Third Action Plan Update was a three step process.

- 1. A template, based on the reporting mechanism developed for *Better Outcomes*, *Brighter Futures*, was created for each individual Department and Agency, showing a list of agreed actions for which each had responsibility. The template listed the partners for each shared commitment and also showed where an action was the responsibility of all Departments and/or Agencies. The template allowed each Department/Agency to provide details (in a maximum of 50 words) on the progress made on each agreed action. Respondents were asked to report under the heading which best described their progress to date:
 - Yes If the agreed action has been finalised
 - In Progress If the agreed action has not yet been completed but is progressing well
 - No If the agreed action has not commenced
- **2.** The information supplied in the templates is displayed in this Update using the original Action Plan and colour coded ticks. Ticks are colour coded as follows:
 - Green Tick indicates action finalised
 - Amber Tick indicates action in progress
 - Red Tick indicates action not commenced
 - Black Tick indicates no update submitted
- **3.** The report can be navigated by clicking on an Action Plan number in the index which links to the Action Plan. Links in the Action Plan connect to the Appendix of returned templates.

Structure of the Report

The Third Action Plan Update Report is divided into the following three sections:

Part 1: Index. Lists the Government Departments and Agencies with their corresponding agreed Actions in the Strategy. The Index may be used to navigate the report by clicking on an individual action. This will allow you to view the action's current progress status in the Action Plan Update Table.

Part 2: **Progress Summary.** Outlines the progress made by each Government Department and/or Agency to progress the 2018 actions in the Strategy.

Part 3: Action Plan Update Table. This Table presents the 73 agreed Actions for 2018, and shows the Department/Agency responsible for each action. A series of colour coded ticks indicates the progress made to date. Further details on the status of each action may be found by clicking on the colour coded ticks which will direct you to the update provided by each responsible Department/Agency.






Graph 1: Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA)


Graph 2: Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht (DCHG)






Graph 6: Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE)


Graph 7: Department of Justice and Equality (DJE)


Graph 8: Department of Health (DoH)


Graph 9: Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport (DTTAS)


Graph 10: Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA)


Graph 11: Health Service Executive (HSE)


Graph 12: Local Government Management Agency (LGMA)


Graph 13: Mental Health Commission (MHC)



The progress of commitments in the Third Annual Report shows a positive picture of how the *National Strategy on Children and Young People's Participation in Decision-Making, 2015-2020* continues to be implemented. All Government Departments and Agencies are actively progressing 68 of the 73 agreed actions for 2018. This means that 93% of the agreed actions have reached completion or are in progress.


Focus on Cross Government/Agency Progress

The majority of actions in this Strategy are being implemented by a lead Government Department/Agency. There is also a number of actions which are the responsibility of all departments and most agencies. These have been reduced from nine in 2016, to eight in 2017 and six for 2018. The six cross-cutting Actions for the current year are G14.2, G15.2, G15.3, G15.4, G15.5 and G15.6.


Graph 16: Action G14.2

Government Departments and Agencies will consult with children and young people appropriately in the development of policy, legislation, research and services, with the support of the DCYA.




Graph 17: Action G15.2

All Statements of Strategy published will include participation of children and young people as an objective and an action.




Graph 18: Action G15.3



Government Departments and Agencies that provide services for children and young people will develop child- and youth-friendly feedback and complaints mechanisms, with Hub na nÓg.




