### DEIS – An introduction

DEIS stands for Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools. DEIS began in September 2006.

More than 240,000 students in 1,200 schools are supported in DEIS.

Schools do not need to apply for DEIS. Schools are included in DEIS based on information from the national Census and the school's enrolment. All schools are considered for DEIS.

### The DEIS Programme in your school

Through DEIS, the Government gives extra resources to schools where more support is needed. This will give all students every opportunity to learn, develop and achieve in school.

Schools in DEIS can receive access to resources including:

- the School Completion Programme
- School Meals Scheme
- the Home School Community Liaison Scheme
- extra materials to help teachers
- more staff
- extra funding.

### School supports for students in the DEIS programme

Schools take particular care to make sure the students do well in English and Maths.

Through DEIS, schools can also provide extra supports to students' such as a breakfast club and/or a homework club.

Schools in DEIS work closely with parents and guardians to support their child's learning.

Schools in DEIS work hard to make sure you and all children feel welcome in the school.

Schools in DEIS encourage students to set high expectations for themselves. Their aim is to support all students to achieve their potential through education.

### How DEIS helps students progress

DEIS supports help children to come to school every day and on time. There are extra supports through DEIS to encourage students to stay in school and complete their education.

Schools in DEIS have extra supports in place through primary school, to move into post-primary, as well as going on to college, apprenticeships or work. Post-primary schools can use extra hours for guidance to help students to make decisions about their future.
