- UNCRPD Article 2"



Goals of the Charter Project

- Provide a vehicle for HEIs and ETBs (institutions) to declare their intent
- Promote the development of institutional policies, structures, and strategies
- Anchor a culture of shared responsibility for universal design, access & inclusion
- Develop a more unified language of and commitment to a universal design approach
- Support institutions to work towards goals in a range of key national and international strategies
