I wish to update my submission to the DRS scheme for plastic bottles & aluminium cans. I hope that glass bottles will be included as the DRS rolls out in next few years - see my previous email below.

Re plastic bottles, will dirty and/or old bottles be able to be returned for recycling? I'm told that dirty bottles cannot be recycled. We collect a lot of old & dirty plastic bottles on the Grand Canal and we always wonder of they will/can be recycled. Hopefully they can, but will people need to clean them to get the refundable deposit?

Over the longer term, we need to move away from plastic bottles to glass and aluminium. Could the DRS be tweaked in some way to help the move away from plastic for producers and consumers alike?

Good luck with rolling out the DRS - it is badly needed.
