II 1 1 Ireland has no evidence of the following infectious diseases: Rinderpest, bluetongue, Rift valley fever, peste de petit ruminants, sheep pox and goat pox, contagious caprine pleuropneumonia and epizootic haemorrhagic disease for the last 12 months, vesicular stomatitis for the last 6 months and that in the last 12 months no vaccination against these diseases has been carried out and that the import of domestic cloven-hoofed animals vaccinated against these diseases is not allowed;

II.1.2. Ireland is free of FMD without vaccination

II.1.3. Ireland is officially free of Brucella abortus and melitensis according to the standards of WOAH.

II.1.4. Ireland is free from infection with bluetongue virus (serotypes 1-24) (1

II.1.5. Ireland operates the following conditions regarding scrapie

II.3.2 They are not intended to be slaughtered for disease eradication purposes as part of an eradication programme

The assembled consignment was not in contact with other animals which do not meet the above-mentioned conditions.

II.3.4 The animals have never received anabolic substances or substances, with a hormonal or anti-hormonal effect nor prohibited substances likely to make the meat of these animals harmful and unfit for human consumption (in accordance with the national regulations in force and based on the national surveillance plan implemented by Irish veterinary authorities).

II.3.5 They have not shown clinical signs or symptoms of diseases listed for ovine (2) animals during the clinical examination, which was carried out, within the 24 hour period prior to departure of the consignment, on (insert date dd/mm/yyyy).
