Privacy Statement

The AAIU requires certain personal data to be collected, along with other information, to comply with Irish and European Law and also under International protocols. The Air Accident Investigation Unit (AAIU) are committed to maintaining and enhancing the privacy and confidentiality of your personal data. We take various steps to protect the information you provide from loss, misuse and unauthorised access or disclosure. These steps take into account the sensitivity of the information we collect, process and store, and the current state of technology. We have implemented appropriate security measures to protect your data, using a range of security technologies and processes. Personal Data collected by the AAIU for the purposes of safety investigation cannot be shared to parties outside of a Safety investigation under the regulations and protocols referred to above unless ordered to do so by the High Court of Ireland. To meet its obligations the AAIU is required to furnish Investigative Authorities in other States with personal information. Some of these Authorities are in the UK or NI or in States outside the EU and EEA. This information is supplied under the Regulations referred to above and the recipient is bound by the rules of professional secrecy and rules in the International protocols.

Personal Information collected outside the purpose of Safety Investigation is collected under the protection of the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport's Data Protection Policy. Data Protection Privacy Notice for Form: Witness Statement Form

Part A:

The AAIU are fully committed to keeping all personal data submitted to us safe and secure. All necessary technical measures have been put in place to ensure the safety and security of the systems which hold your data.

Being open and transparent in how we process your personal data is important to us and therefore we aim to keep you informed of the purpose(s) for which your personal data will be used and why, where it may be shared elsewhere and why, and how long your data may be held by the AAIU

Data Controller and Data Protection Officer

The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport has two data Controllers:

- 1. The Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport
- 2. The Driver and Vehicle Computer Services Division of the Department

The AAIU is the statutory body in Ireland responsible for the investigation of aviation occurrences and is functionally independent of the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport.

Personal data processed by the Department will only be used for the specific purpose(s) as outlined when the data is collected, or in later communications, and will only be used in accordance with the Data Protection legislation in force.

Data Subject Rights:

When you provide personal data to us you have certain rights available to you in relation to that data. These rights are outlined below and can be exercised by contacting the Data Protection Officer, as detailed above, indicating which right you wish to exercise:

- The right to be informed
- The right of access
- The right to rectification
- The right to erasure
- The right to restrict processing
- The right to data portability
- The right to object
- Rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling

Finally, as a data subject, should you be unhappy with the provision of information in this Notice you can make a complaint to the Data Protection Commission, which is Ireland's Supervisory Authority for data protection matters.

Part B: Information Specific to the Data Bring Collected in Witness Statement Form

The following data is specific information in relation to the personal data processed for the purposes of Aircraft Accident Investigation.

Specific Purpose:

The Witness Statement Form is used where an investigation into an Aircraft Accident, Serious Incident or Incident is being conducted. Certain personal data is required to process this Witness Statement Form correctly in adherence with our obligation to investigate occurrences. The AAIU collects personal information to meet our obligations for the investigation of Air Accidents, Serious Incidents and Incidents. This will include personal information of those involved in witnessing an aviation occurrence and such information is sourced through the use of the Witness Statement Form. The AAIU also receives personal information from third parties, including those outside of the EU in order to fulfil our International, European and National obligations to investigate or assist in the investigation of aviation occurrences.

Legal Basis:

The AAIU is required to carry out its investigations in accordance with International Convention, Regulation (EU) 996/2010 and S.I. 460 of 2009, and is required to comply with the International protocols as laid down in ICAO Annex 13. These Regulations allow the AAIU to obtain any information that is necessary to carry out a Safety Investigation. The Regulations also bind any person that participates in a Safety Investigation to the applicable rules of professional secrecy

including the anonymity of those involved or those who have provided information in the context of a Safety Investigation.

The only way the AAIU can be required to share personal data outside of a Safety Investigation would be if ordered by the High Court of Ireland.

Recipients:

The AAIU collects information for the purposes of Safety Investigation. Information cannot be shared outside of an investigation by Irish and European Law and also under International protocols. The only time personal Information is shared outside of a Safety Investigation is if the AAIU is so ordered by the High Court of Ireland. To meet its obligations the AAIU is required to furnish other States with personal information, some of these States are outside the EU. This information is supplied under the Regulations referred to above and the recipient is bound by the rules of professional secrecy and rules in the International protocols.

Transferred outside the EU/EEA and countries with which there is no adequacy agreement¹

The personal information you provide in this form may be transferred to Aircraft Accident Investigation body(ies) in the UK or NI or outside the EU/EEA. This may occur, if that body(ies) is involved in the investigation of this occurrence. Another State may be involved in an investigation if the occurrence has taken place in a State outside the EU/EEA and involving an aircraft on the Irish Aircraft Register, or if the occurrence has taken place within the Irish State or Irish Territorial Waters involving an aircraft registered in that non EU/EEA State.

Retention period:

The AAIU holds all personal data securely. The AAIU will retain personal data that is necessary for Safety Investigation purposes and this will extend beyond the publication of the investigation report. This is because the information is pertinent to subsequent Safety Investigations or there is a possibility the investigation could be reopened at a later date.

Data provision being statutory or contractual obligation

The personal data provided for this purpose is being requested under the requirements of S.I. 460 of 2009 and REGULATION (EU) No 996/2010.

Automated decision making

Automated decision make is not part of the processing of the personal data included in the Witness Statement Form.
