

Total Revenue of €15,368 million



Exchequer deficit of €903 million. Year-on-year improvement of €266 million.













## **Non-Tax Revenue and Capital Receipts**



 Non-tax Revenue of €75 million down €24 million (24.5%) year-on-year.




- Capital Receipts of €964 million down €601 million (38.4%) year-on-year.
- No repayments from the Social Insurance Fund as there was no requirement, in the year-to-date, for any short term cash flow loans to the Social Insurance Fund.




**Gross Voted Current**










# **Non-Voted Expenditure**



- €2,001 million
  - €2 million (0.1%) below profile
  - €34 million (1.7%) down year-on-year.



- €672 million
  - €397 million (37.1%) below profile
     timing issues with EU Budget contribution
  - €1,083 million (61.7%) down year-on-year No requirement for short term cash flow loans to the SIF
- Total Non-voted Expenditure of €2,673 million
- €1,118 million down y-o-y
- €399 million below profile





# **Summary**

- Exchequer deficit of €903 million. Year-on-year improvement of €266 million.
- Tax revenues down 2.4% on profile but up 3.2% y-o-y.
- **Gross voted expenditure** on public services down 0.9% on profile but up 5.5% year-on-year.
