I would like to make the following observations on the proposed legislation mentioned above:

I whole-heartedly welcome and endorse the introduction of the protection of salmoid species in the seven waters, offered in this draft legislation.

As evidence arrives daily that humans seem to be hell-bent on destroying every living thing on the planet, this small step of conservation offers some relief.

I am amongst the most fortunate of men. I have been able to fish the great lakes of New Zealand for rainbows and Yellowstone Lake for cutthroat trout. Corrib, and the other six lakes in the west of Ireland are on a par with these world famous fisheries. They have no equal anywhere in Europe. They are the fishing jewel in Ireland's crown.

Resist the overtures of the pike lobby; Ireland is awash with pike; there are probably more pike than people on this island. Pike are everywhere in every lake and stream. The possibility of catching pike is almost unlimited. No reasonable person would deny the pike angler his sport but to allow pike to decimate salmonoid stocks in the Western Lakes is an act of wilful vandalism. Worldwide, salmon stocks are collapsing and everything that can be done, must be done to protect them. This legislation will do nothing but help that effort.

I lived in England for 35 years where any body of water bigger than a postage stamp is owned by someone who will charge you for the privilege of fishing it, even if it holds no fish. I now live on the shores of Lough Corrib. Every day I get up and go to my bedroom window and look out over Innisthis and Innishthat and it's all free. Yeats would have loved this place. Irishmen, do you realise how lucky you are?

Thanks is due to Sean Kyne TD, the Inland Fisheries Department, the volunteers of the Oughterard Hatchery who, at no cost to the state, do their bit to ensure the survival of Corrib trout.

To Sean Kyne:

I don't know you and I don't know what you have achieved in politics but whether you know it or not, I doubt if you'll do anything of more import than enact this piece of legislation.

This is your Legacy and generations to come will thank you for it.

Designated Salmonid Waters Bye-Law

Sean Kyne, T.D., Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment, gives notice of his intention to make the Designated Salmonid Waters Bye-Law.

This Bye-law provides for the designation of the waters and their tributaries, specified in the Schedule below, to be managed primarily for the benefit of salmonid species. These waters are already designated in fisheries management policy.

The Bye-law also introduces a daily bag limit of 4 pike in those waters.

Putting or transfer of any fish species to the designated waters shall require a written application to Inland Fisheries Ireland (IFI) and is only permitted with the written consent of IFI.

I fully support Minister Sean Kyne in his designated Salmonid waters Bye Law 2018. This bye law will protect Lough Corrib and six other lakes in law and guarantee the control of pike by Inland Fisheries Ireland by gill netting and other means in the management of the lakes as salmonid waters.

I further propose that the daily bag limit for pike be increased to 10. This will have two benefits: it will allow anglers, both domestic and overseas visitors, who wish to take fish for the table to do so but will also allow anglers to contribute to and aid in the management of the seven listed lakes and their tributaries and distributaries as salmonid systems. Pike are deemed to be an aquatic nuisance species according to the Global Invasive Species Database and are classed as non-native non-benign under the EU water framework directive monitoring programme.

Further to this I would recommend that the Inland Fisheries remove the statement that pike are native from their website as I believe this to be a misrepresentation of information in Dr Pedreschi's paper.

I also propose that other wild brown trout lakes including Lough Lein Killarney, and Lough Currane, and others, be similarly managed as salmonid waters and that pike management and control be practiced on those waters too. There are many fine pike fishing waters in this country and only a few pristine trout and salmon waters which are the envy of anglers the world over. We must cherish what we have and not allow such water bodies become mixed fisheries as this would have a detrimental effect on our great lakes as well as on the local and national economy.

I recommend restricting the movement of boats between water bodies to prevent the spread of invasive species. Any such activity should be done so under the supervision of IFI officers.

All of our remaining water systems where pike and other coarse fish are absent must be given salmonid status to guarantee their protection from future risk of invasive species introduction, such as perch, pike, roach etc. Any illegal fish introductions should carry severe custodial sentences and heavy fines in order to protect these systems and their unique wild salmonid stocks.

To whom it may concern, I oppose the proposed new bye-law to allow for the removal of 4 pike of any size on the waters listed. I believe that it will make enforcement of the current National pike bye-law 809 of 2006 completely unenforceable on all other waters as people may falsely claim that any pike found in their possession were caught in one of the 7 listed waters. I oppose any change in pike bye law 809 of 2006 on the named waters as these waters are famous for producing specimen pike and the introduction of the bye-law will adversely affect pike angling tourism on these waters as there will be less large pike to catch if people are allowed to catch and take 4 pike of ANY size. Genuine pike anglers practice 'catch and release'. The National Strategy for Angling Development – Market Research 2015 recognises the 'Great Western Lakes' as one of Ireland's 'top class pike fisheries'. I oppose the proposed new bye-law as it is unnecessary. The ESRI paper 563 of May 2017 clearly states that 61% of brown trout anglers "are negatively disposed towards pike stock management". If the purpose of the bye-law is to help protect brown trout then the bye-law should be limiting the number and size of the brown trout an angler can take per day. In this regard perhaps it should mirror the current pike bye law 809 of 2006 i.e. one brown trout of up to 50cms per day. I oppose the proposed bye-law as it undermines the current Inland Fisheries Ireland ongoing review of pike policy in designated wild brown trout waters and pre-empts the review group's findings. This makes for bad and ill-informed fishery management. I oppose the proposed bye-law providing for the designation of the waters named under this proposed bye-law, their tributaries and distributaries as salmonid waters, if such designation infers that any existing species of fish living at present within these fisheries that is not a salmonid, can or should be removed by virtue of this designation. Dear Minister Kyne,

It has come to our attention of late that there may be some new designations of Wild Brown Trout Fisheries which is to have statutory protection, we believe Lough Ennell's name has been omitted from this list.

We here at Lough Ennell Trout Preservation Association (LETPA) feel that Lough Ennell should be included in any such designation.

Lough Ennell is a large limestone lake in the midlands, which is renowned for its ability to produce wild brown trout. It currently holds the Irish record for largest wild brown trout, a fish weighing-in at 26lbs 2oz.

Lough Ennell has been managed as a wild brown trout fishery for well over a hundred years, firstly by voluntary club members, then with the introduction of the Fisheries Trust, followed by the Shannon regional fisheries board and as it is now Inland Fisheries Ireland (I.F.I.). In the past the trout spawn was harvested from the Lough Ennell streams and sold to other lakes all over the country and all over the world (as means of paying for the management of the trout fishery) such is the high regard that the native wild trout of Lough Ennell have by anglers.

LETPA in conjunction with I.F.I. have for the past number of years been carrying out maintenance and enhancement works on the spawning streams which flow into the lake to maintain and increase the stock of trout in the lake. This work has been funded through grants from the Midlands Fishery Fund (M.F.F.) and also monies from our own club, work which we are keen to continue into the future. Lough Ennell is a truly wild brown trout fishery, it has not received stocking from fish farm sources, unlike one of the lakes that has been included in the list, which received stockings of farmed trout from I.F.I. as recently as late in the year 2011.

We would ask that you would consider Lough Ennell for inclusion in any "Wild Brown Trout Fishery" designation. As Lough Ennell is already classed as a wild brown trout fishery by I.F.I. we would hope this would stand Lough Ennell in good favour in this regard.

To whom it may concern.

I am writing to express my full support for the Draft proposals of Mr Sean Kyne T.D. for Lough Corrib. I have fished Lough Corrib for over 50 years throughout the season, have been a member of Oughterard anglers for nearly as long and have concluded that the stocks of brown trout have dramatically decreased. When the stock survey was done in 1996 it was deemed that the stock was poor (I have a letter from a former Fishery board officer confirming this) and when the survey was done in 2012 the stock was deemed to be lower again. This was surely time for Inland Fisheries Ireland to sit up, take notice and act, but unfortunately very little was done.

Lough Corrib is a world renowned brown trout fishing destination and the importance of this to local economies, guest houses, ghillies etc. cannot be underestimated.

At the time of writing reports are of good trout fishing, however this is only happening in very small areas with a specific style of fishing, remember that the lake is 44,000 acres, a vast area and sadly now a lot of it is almost totally unproductive. The areas being fished heavily at present hold large numbers of prime breeding stock, this in turn must have a great impact on the sustainability of the lake, if too many fish are not released. There are many parts of the lake that I used to fish in years gone by with great success but now do not bother as they are more or less totally unproductive.

I would also like to make the following comments regarding Lough Corrib.

1. Pike control is of the utmost importance for the future of the stocks of trout in the lake, these must be properly controlled in all parts of the lake, and totally eradicated in the Owenriff system, which is a major spawning ground.
2. I propose that a bag limit of 1 trout per angler per day be imposed.
3. All competitions to be run on a catch and release basis, using measurement.
4. Major reconstruction and management of all spawning rivers and streams to be implemented.
5. There is increasing amount of algae, slime, on foreshore rocks, shallows etc, that never used to be there, so water quality still has to be an issue.
6. Lough Corrib is a jewel in the fishing world but is slowly being allowed to die, there are not nearly as many boats fishing as there were 25 years ago, surely an indication of the state of the lake. Inland Fisheries Ireland are responsible for the lake and in turn are solely responsible for its demise.
7. The hatcheries on the lake must be used to full potential in order to help the natural reproduction of stocks.
