## <u>Directions on Completing the Food Chain Information (FCI)</u> <u>Form for Farmed Game</u>

This form will fulfil the obligations of the owner/ keeper (person in charge) under Regulation (EC) 853/2004 in relation to farmed game going for slaughter. The regulation is part of a pro-active 'farm to fork' approach to food safety controls in the European Community. It supports food safety management systems at slaughter plants by flagging potential hazards.

From Monday 18<sup>th</sup> Feb 2013, all farmed game being presented for slaughter should be accompanied by the FCI form. If any animal or batch of animals arrives at the slaughterhouse without food chain information, the operator must immediately notify the official veterinarian (OV). Slaughter of the animal(s) may not take place until the OV so permits.

All parties (i.e. farmer, haulier and slaughterhouse operator) must sign the form in accordance with the directions below in order for slaughter to take place.

In the event that the herd owner/ keeper cannot sign the declaration at the end of the owner/ keeper section of Form A, he/she should also fill out the additional food chain information (Form B) and attach it to Form A.

#### Registration of Holdings sending Farmed Game to Slaughter

All holdings farming animals for placing on the market for human consumption need to be registered with the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM). If you have a herd number issued in respect of farming activities involving cattle, sheep and/or goats on the same holding as the deer this herd number fulfills the necessity to be registered and should be provided on the form. A number of holdings farming deer (and not cattle/sheep/goats) have already specifically registered with DAFM and have been issued a herd number.

For those farmed game holdings which are not registered, they must make immediate contact with their local DAFM Regional Veterinary Office to facilitate registration. For holdings which were unaware of this requirement, a grace period is being allowed to facilitate registration with DAFM. This will come to an end on Monday  $8^{th}$  April 2013. From that date all farmed game being presented to slaughter must come from a registered holding and the herd number must be entered on the Food Chain Information Form.

#### Movement of Farmed Game from Northern Ireland directly to Slaughter

Farmed game from Northern Ireland moving directly to slaughter in ROI must be accompanied by FCI. This can either be on this form or on the FCI document approved by the authorities in Northern Ireland. Such animals must also be accompanied by a health certificate.

### Owner/Keeper Declaration to Slaughter Plant Explained

- The farm/holding of origin is not under disease restriction. [Where the farm has been placed under restriction by the local Regional Veterinary Office e.g. the herd maybe restricted due to TB in either the farmed deer or cattle on the holding:
  - o Complete the owner/keeper section of Form A but do not sign the declaration
  - o Record details of the restriction on Form B
  - Make details of the restriction known to the slaughterhouse in advance so that separation in the lairage may be initiated if necessary to prevent crosscontamination]
- The animals on the holding are healthy and have not tested positive for any condition that might render their meat unfit for human consumption. [Your veterinary surgeon may have diagnosed a condition in your herd (for example salmonella infection) which might suggest that extra precautions should be taken during slaughter and/or postmortem inspection of your animals].
- No substance has been given to the animals which might render their meat unfit for human consumption. [For example, no growth promoters have been given to the animals either in feed or by way of injection, dosing, etc.]
- All prescribed medication withdrawal periods have been observed. [If antibiotics, worm doses, etc. have been given to the animals, the relevant withdrawal period has been observed.]
- All animals in the load are healthy and in a fit condition to be transported to the slaughter house. [Animal welfare rules require that animals must not be transported if to do so would cause unnecessary suffering.]
- The means of transport is suitable and in a hygienic condition at the time of loading. [Animal welfare rules require that animals must not be transported in overcrowded conditions or in unsuitable transport vehicles.]

## <u>Directions on Completing the Food Chain Information (FCI)</u> Form for Farmed Game

### **Note regarding Farmed Deer and TB**

- Where Tuberculosis has been **confirmed** in farmed deer from the holding by way of post-mortem results at the slaughterhouse, or by on-farm testing by a veterinary practitioner, the owner/ keeper still fills in the owner/ keeper section of Form A, but must not sign the declaration on Form A. Instead of signing the declaration, s/he must also complete Form B and record the details on this form.
- Where Tuberculosis is suspected in farmed deer from the holding by way of post-mortem at the slaughterhouse, and awaiting laboratory confirmation, the owner/ keeper still fills in the owner/ keeper section of Form A, but must not sign the declaration on Form A. Instead of signing the declaration, s/he must also complete Form B and record the details on this form.
- Where cattle are also maintained on the holding and the holding is **restricted** by the local DAFM Regional Veterinary Office due to bovine TB, the owner/ keeper still fills in the owner/ keeper section of Form A, but must not sign the declaration on Form A. Instead of signing the declaration, s/he must also complete Form B and record the details on this form.
- Under S.I. 101/2008 owners/ keepers/ persons in charge of farmed deer, or their private veterinary practitioner, have a statutory obligation to inform their local DAFM Regional Veterinary Office in the event that TB is suspected or confirmed in farmed deer on their holding.
