The group comprised of Mary Rice, Corinne Fillod, Catherine Geoghegan, Fiona Sloggett, and Patricia Brady. They used all their skills to deliver beautiful home baking. There were also very willing sponsors from: Gary Dunne Centra in Stamullen, Darragh McCullough for his flowers from Elmgrove Farm, Rosaleen Richardson from Richardson Promotional Goods in Balbriggan and Miriam Doran for painted stones and pictures.

Peter thanked Noeleen Sheridan Director of Nursing and the Trinity Care Group for sponsoring in a significant way the Community Garden in 2017. He said that the GCA hoped to lend more support in the weeks to come and would be open to hearing what particular needs they had that could be addressed. One of the special categories for potential support are those residents who may not have the comfort of relatives to visit them. Noeleen Sheridan on behalf of all the staff and residents thanked sincerely the GCA for its generous gifts and was as ever very appreciative of the good neighbours they have in Gormanston.

The PPN are partnering with Sligo Heritage Office to promote a range of biodiversity and heritage initiatives under the health and wellbeing campaign. We are also working with Sligo Cycle campaign to try and raise awareness about the abuse of empty roads in terms of reckless and dangerous driving and the implications as more pedestrians are using local roads.

This has been especially beneficial to people during the recent days of fine weather and reduces the risk of either of these groups leaving their homes unnecessarily.

Wicklow Public Participation Network are working with Garden County Radio to highlight the great work that voluntary groups are doing in providing services to the community during COVID19. Garden County Radio has been pre-recording interviews with volunteers to find out about their projects and initiatives and then it is being aired on the radio the following day. The interviews have also been turned into podcasts so now there is a little radio history of how Co Wicklow Communities have galvanised to support the most vulnerable members of their local communities.

An inclusive innovative communication stream has been put in place by **Kerry Public Participation Network** and Catherine White. The messages are than circulated through the Kerry PPN Facebook page and Kerry County Council also circulates them through the KCC Twitter account. What an excellent example of ensuring that as many people as possible receive Covid 19 updates.
