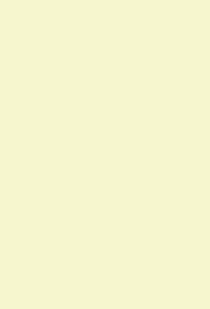

General

This is the nineteenth issue of the annual “Statistical Information on Social Welfare Services” prepared by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. It sets out comprehensive data relating to services provided by the Department.

The statistics set out in this report relate to 2001 and earlier years. In the case of data relating to recipients and beneficiaries, the figures, unless otherwise stated, refer to the 31st December each year. Several tables, which provide a breakdown of recipients or beneficiaries by some characteristic such as number of dependants or age, are referred to as “estimated”. This means that the proportionate breakdown, which is considered to be a reliable estimate, was established at a date other than, but close to, 31st December.

Expenditure figures for 2001 are provisional pending certification by the Comptroller and Auditor General. All Expenditure figures have been converted to Euro amounts.

Source of Data

The source for the statistics presented, unless otherwise stated, is the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments

Time Series data are given, where available. However, the introduction of new payments and changes to existing payments affect the comparability of different years’ figures in some instances. Relevant tables are footnoted where appropriate.

Section G provides details of employment supports including Back to Work Allowance, Back to Work Enterprise Allowance, Back to Education Allowance, the Student's Summer Jobs Scheme, Family Income Supplement and Farm Assist.

Section H provides details of the range of payments available under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance scheme.

Section J provides details of Treatment Benefits, Free Schemes and other miscellaneous payments. In addition this section includes information on the Voluntary and Community Services as well as the Family Services administered by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

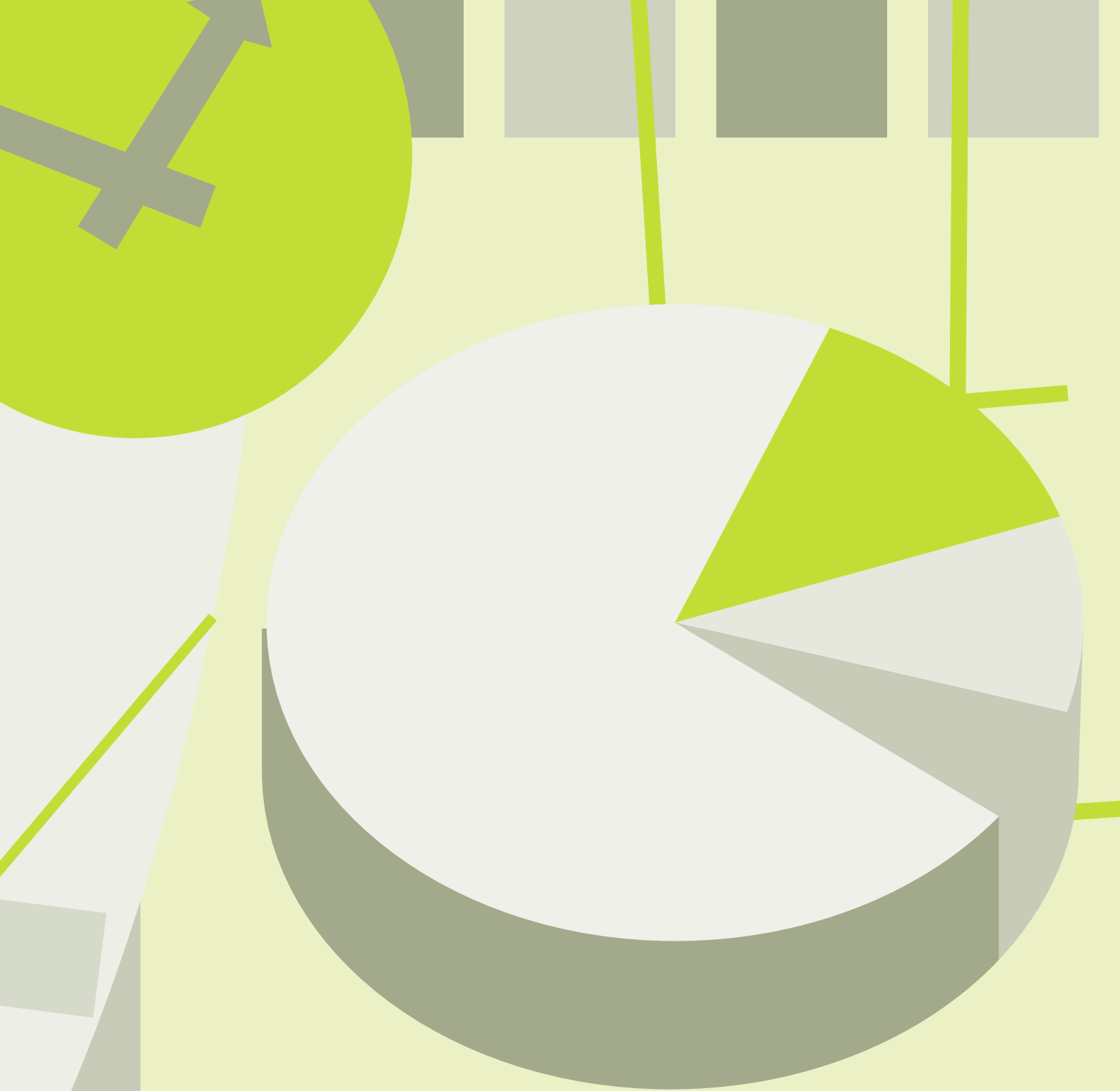

Section A: Summary and Financial

Expenditure

Total Social Welfare expenditure in 2001 was €7,842 million, an increase of 16.8% over 2000. Expenditure in 2001 represented 26.2% of Gross Current Government expenditure and was equivalent to 8.2% of GNP (Table A2). The main areas of expenditure by programme group were Old Age (25.3%), Widow's, Widower's and One-Parent Families (18%), Illness, Disability and Caring (15.7%), Unemployment Support (9.2%), Child Related Payments (13.5%), Supplementary Welfare Allowance (4.6%), and Employment Support (3.6%). Administration of the social welfare system accounted for 4.8% of total expenditure (Graph A1).

Total Social Welfare expenditure was financed by the Exchequer (53%) and by the Social Insurance Fund (47%). The Social Insurance Fund was financed by Pay Related Social Insurance contributions from employers (75.1%), employees (19.7%), the self-employed (4.4%) and investment income (1.1%). See Tables A6 and A7.

Recipients of Weekly Social Welfare Payments

Over 903,000 people were in receipt of a weekly welfare payment at the end of 2001. As these payments included increases in respect of nearly 127,000 Qualified Adults and over 404,000 Children, there were over 1,460,000 beneficiaries in all. The number of recipients and beneficiaries increased by 33,381 and 27,800 respectively, year on year.

Expenditure on Social Welfare by Programme, 2001

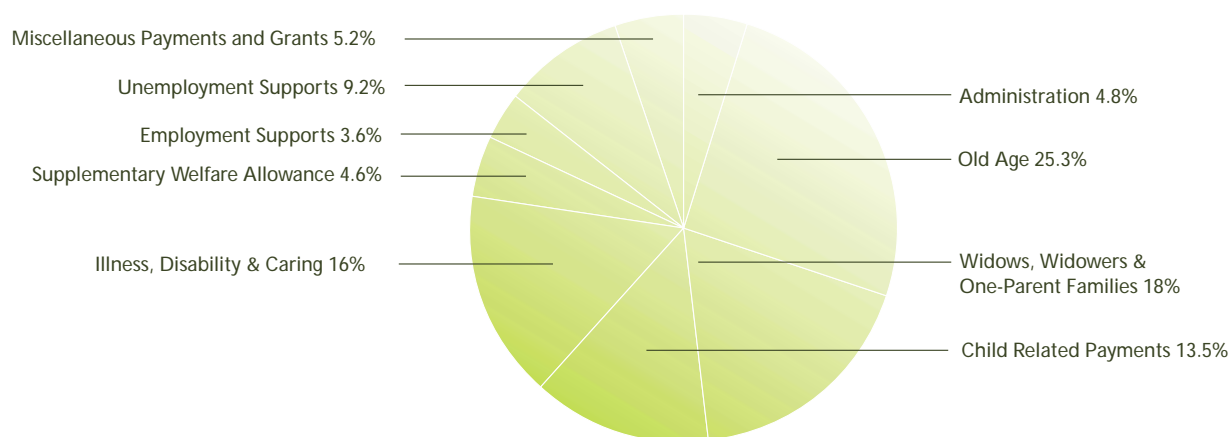

Financing of the Social Insurance Fund, 2001

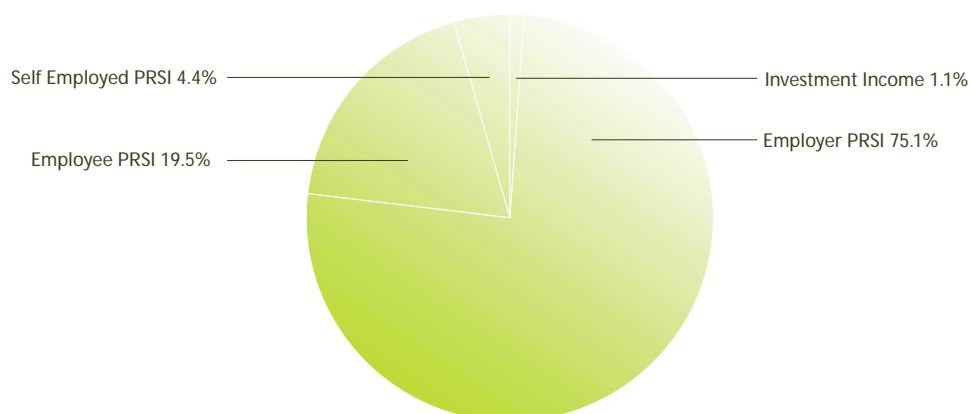

Number of Recipients of weekly Social Welfare Payments by Programme Area, 2001

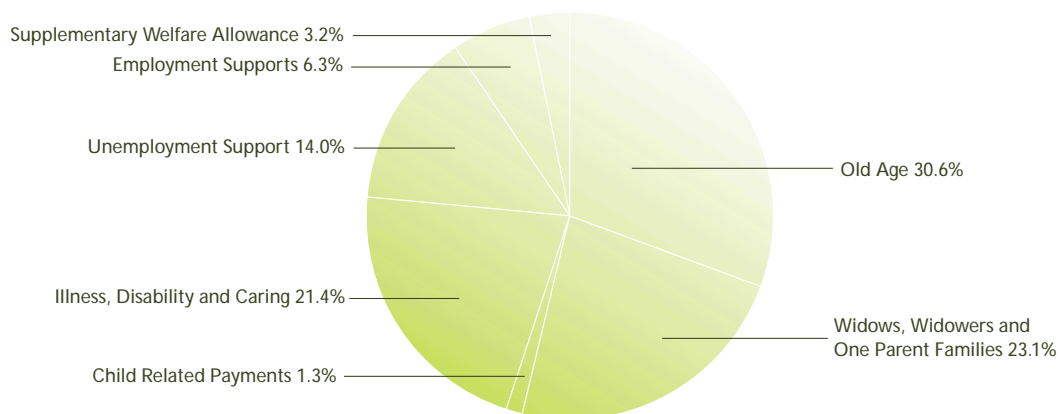

Analysis of Insured Population, 2000/2001

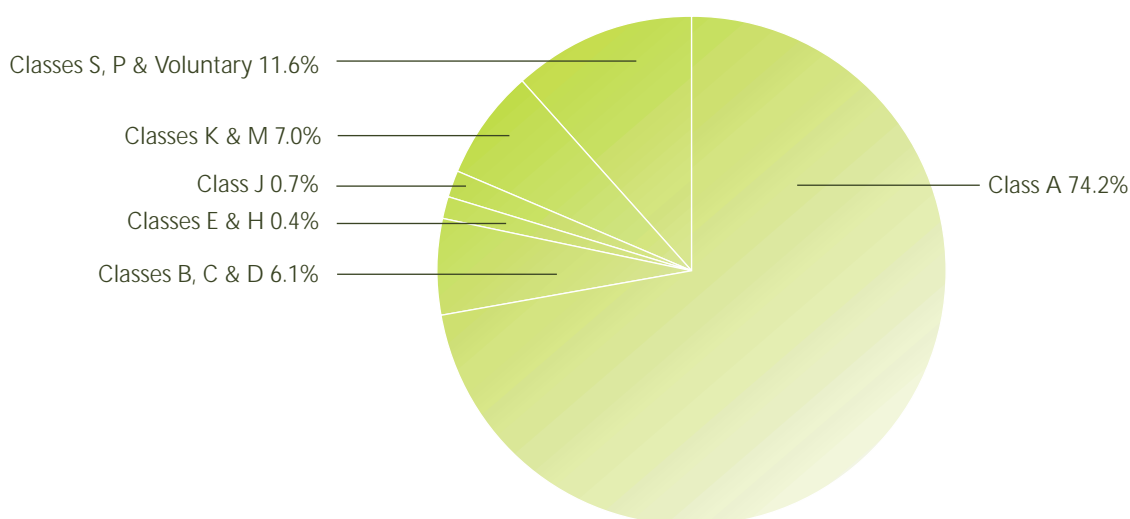

Section B: Old Age

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Old Age payments was over €1,987 million in 2001. This represents an increase of 16.4 % on 2000.

The overall number of Old Age payments rose by 8,305 in 2001, an increase of 3.1%. The number of people in receipt of a contributory pension (Old Age Contributory Pension and Retirement Pension) based on social insurance contributions rose by 10,610 while the number of people in receipt of the means tested Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 1,591. The number of persons in receipt of Pre-Retirement Allowance fell by 714 in 2001.

Over the last ten years, the number of recipients of Old Age (Contributory) Pension rose by 22,160 and the number of recipients of Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 24,494. The number of recipients of Retirement Pension increased by 25,141, and the number of recipients of Pre-Retirement Allowance has fallen by 3,631 in the same period. Number of Recipients of Old Age Pensions, 1992 - 2001

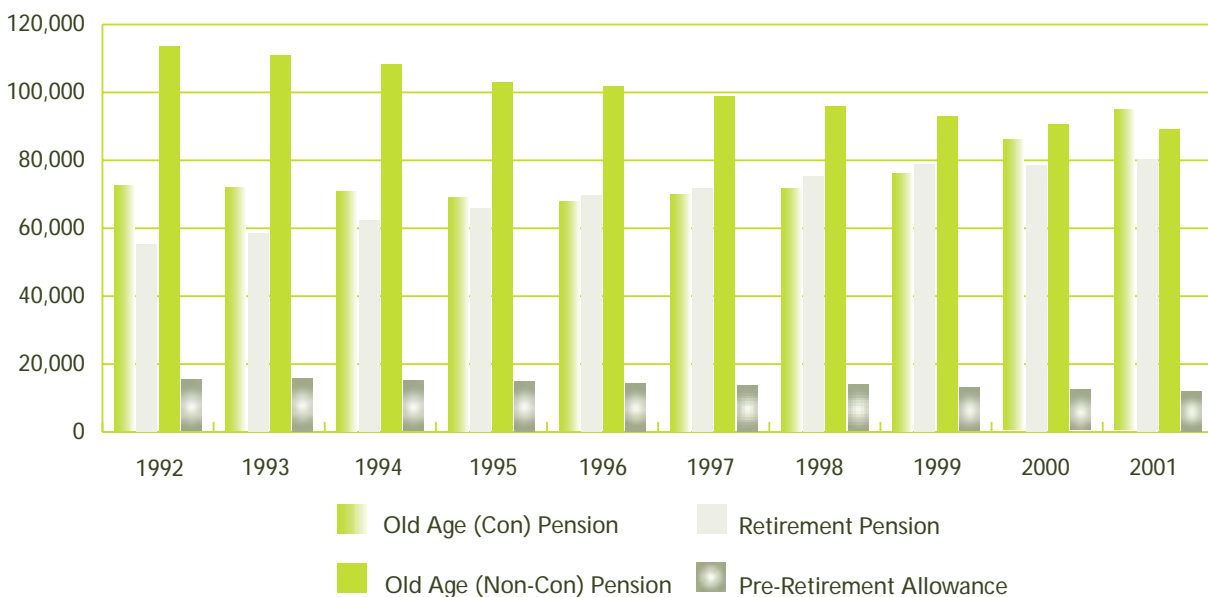

Section C: Widows, Widowers and One-Parent Families

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Widows, Widowers and One-Parent Families increased by 11.7% overall.

The payment in this programme group with both the largest expenditure and number of recipients is Widow's and Widower's (Contributory) Pension. At the end of 2001, there were 101,267 recipients (91,172 widows and 10,095 widowers). Expenditure in 2001 was over €672 million which represented an increase of 12.6% over 2000.

The number of recipients of Deserted Wife's Benefit and Deserted Wife's Allowance declined during 2001. This arises as a result of the discontinuation of these payments for new claimants with effect from January 1997. One-Parent Family Payment replaced these payments, Prisoners Wife's Allowance and Lone Parent's Allowance from that date.

Expenditure on One-Parent Family Payment increased by 11.9%, while the number of recipients rose by over 3,000.

Number of Recipients of One-Parent Family Payment by Age and Sex, 2001

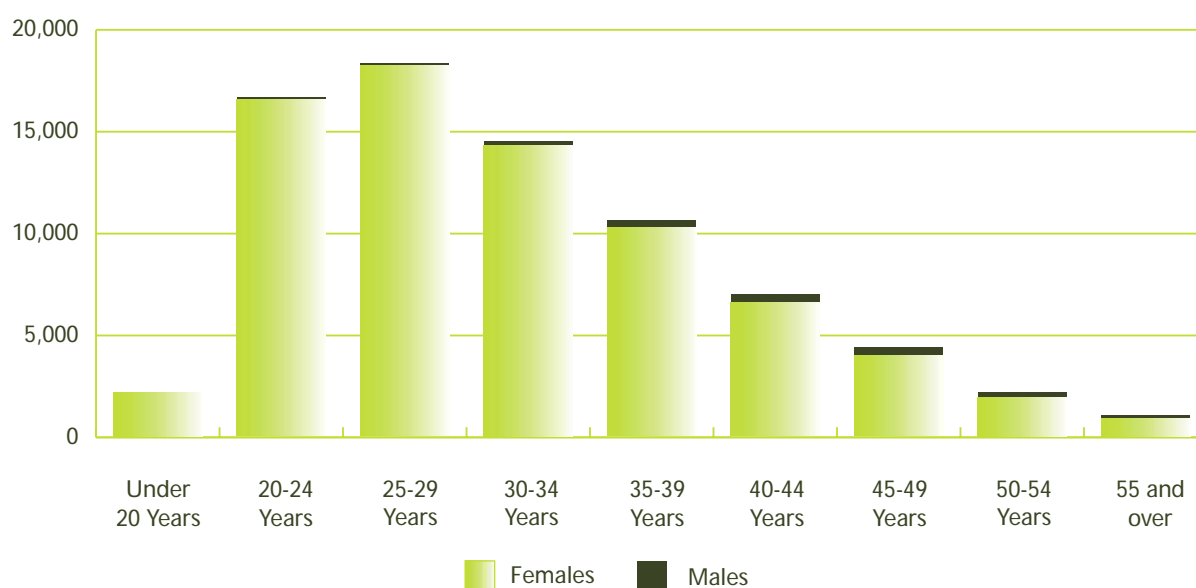

Section D: Child Related Payments

Expenditure and Recipients

This section relates to payments made in respect of children such as Child Benefit, Orphan’s Pensions, and Maternity related payments. For ease of reference, this section also gives details of increases in respect of qualified children which are payable with social welfare payments (See Table D10). It should be noted, however, that for the purpose of apportioning expenditure between programmes, the cost of qualified child increases are included with the main payment e.g. Qualified Child increases paid with Old Age pensions are included in the ‘Old Age’ programme.

Expenditure on payments in this programme group rose by 50.2% in 2001. The breakdown of Child Benefit by family size shows that 74.2% of recipient families in 2001 have either one or two children. The equivalent percentage for 1993 was 65.8%. See Table D8 and Graph D1. The number of families receiving Child Benefit rose by 4,079 to 514,919. However, the total number of children in respect of whom Child Benefit is paid declined by 3,835 to 1,014,340.

Expenditure on Child Benefit increased by €327 million in 2001, an increase of 51.3% while Maternity Benefit expenditure increased by over €20 million, an increase of 36%.

Number of Families Receiving Child Benefit by Number of Child Beneficiaries, 1993 - 2001

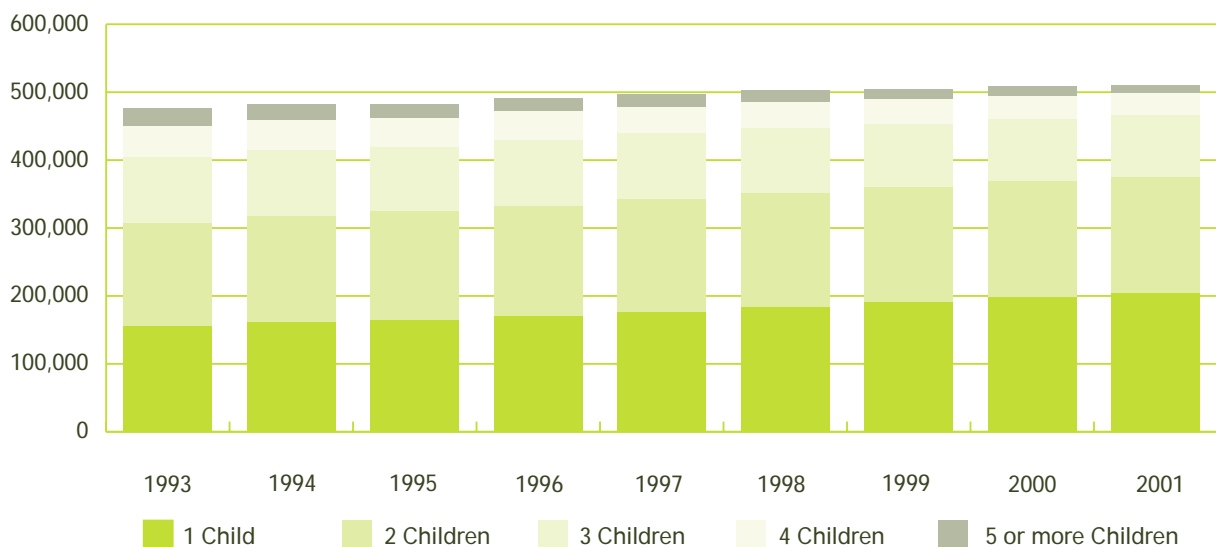

Section E: Illness, Disability and Caring

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Disability Benefit and Invalidity Pension increased by 17.3% and 13.8% respectively. Disability Allowance was introduced in October 1996 and replaced Disabled Persons Maintenance Allowance (DPMA) which was administered by the Health Boards. Expenditure on Disability Allowance increased by 19.0% to €332 million. There are now 57,655 recipients of the scheme.

Carer's Allowance was introduced in October 1990. Expenditure on Carer's Allowance increased by over €30 million in 2001, an increase of 30.9%. There are now 18,785 recipients of the Scheme, an increase of 2,307, year on year.

Graph E1 and Table E4 show details of the numbers of Carer's Allowance recipients from 1992 to 2001.

New Payment

A new Carer's Benefit scheme was introduced in October 2000. Carer's Benefit is a payment made to insured persons who leave the workforce to care for a person(s) who require full time care and attention. The number of recipients increased by 375 to 425, year on year.

Number of Recipients of Carer's Allowance by Sex, 1992 to 2001.

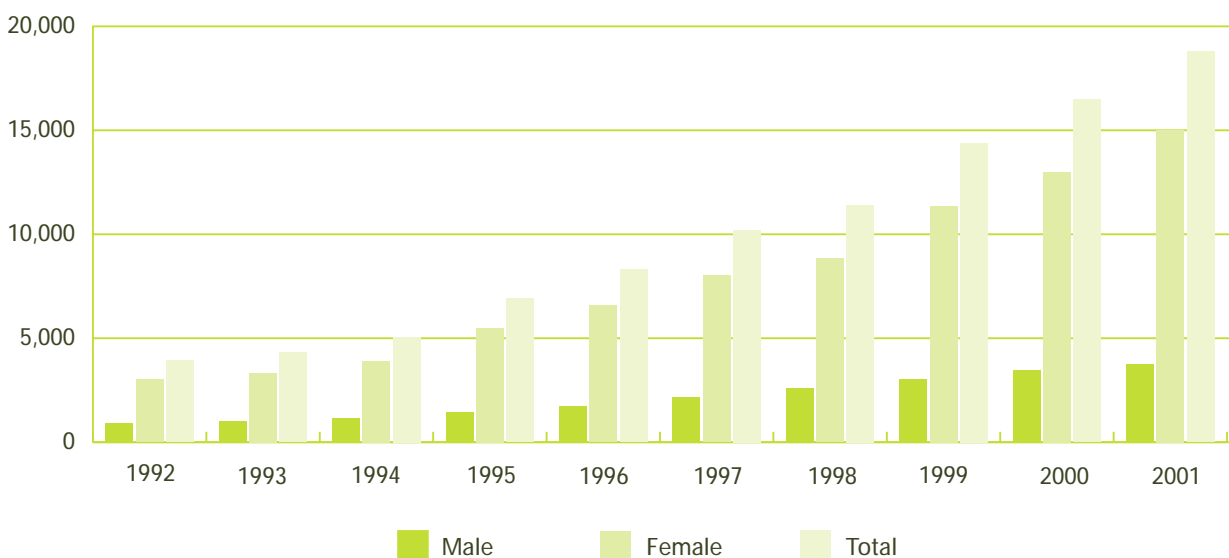

Section F: Unemployment Supports

The statistics in this section of the report relate to the Live Register, expenditure and recipients of unemployment payments;

Live Register and Unemployment Payments

The Live Register is a monthly statistical count compiled by the Central Statistics Office of certain categories of persons registered with the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs for Unemployment Benefit, Unemployment Assistance and credited Social Insurance contributions.

The Live Register comprises of the following classes of persons under the age of 65 years:

- (i) all claimants of Unemployment Benefit excluding systematic short-time workers,
- (ii) applicants for Unemployment Assistance excluding smallholders and self-employed persons,
- (iii) other registrants including applicants for credited Social Welfare contributions but excluding those directly involved in an industrial dispute.

This means that not all persons who are in receipt of Unemployment Benefit or Assistance are on the Live Register. Some persons who are included on the Live Register e.g. applicants for credited contributions, are not in receipt of an unemployment benefit or assistance payment.

Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaced the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999 and 2000. There were 750 recipients of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance at the end of 1999, 163 at the end of December 2000 and 88 at the end of December 2001.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in Section G (Employment Supports). Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance shown in this Section includes expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance in 1999 and earlier years. This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section G.

Trends

Overall expenditure on Unemployment Supports decreased by 1.9% over 2000.

Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance fell by over €39 million over 2000, a decrease of 8.4%. Expenditure on Unemployment Benefit rose by over €22 million, an increase of 9.7% over 2000.

The Live Register increased by 10,820 during 2001, an increase of 7.6%. Table F14 shows the numbers on the Live Register by County in 2000 and 2001 and the percentage increase/decrease in each county.

Expenditure on Unemployment Benefit/Pay Related Benefit and Unemployment Assistance, 1992-2001

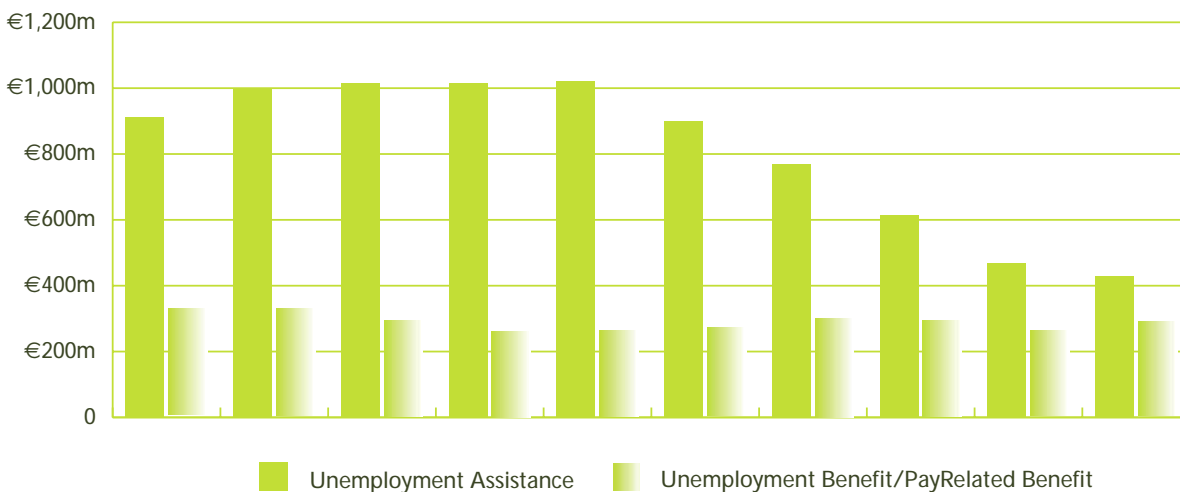

Number of Persons on the Live Register by Age and Sex, 2001

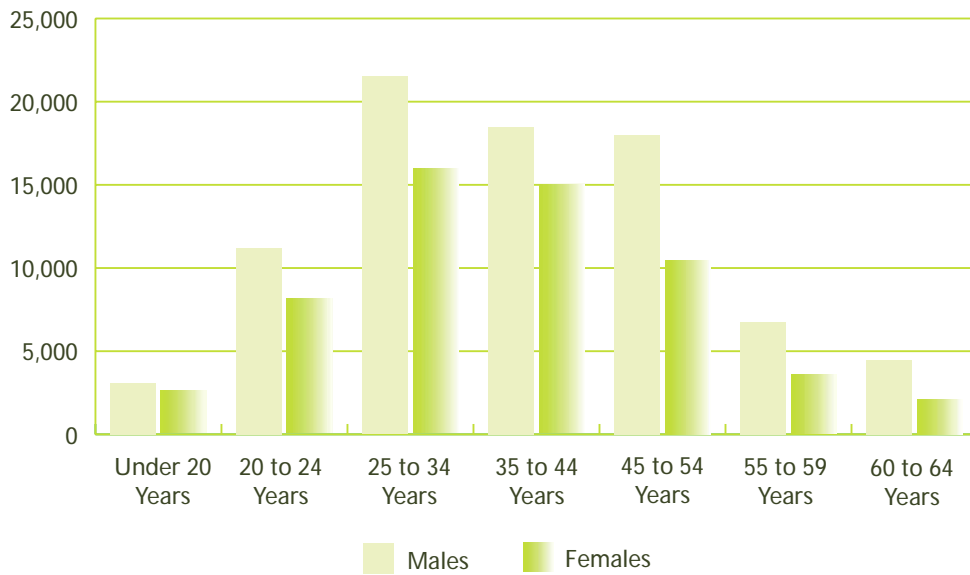

Number of persons on the Live Register in October 2001, by Sex and Duration

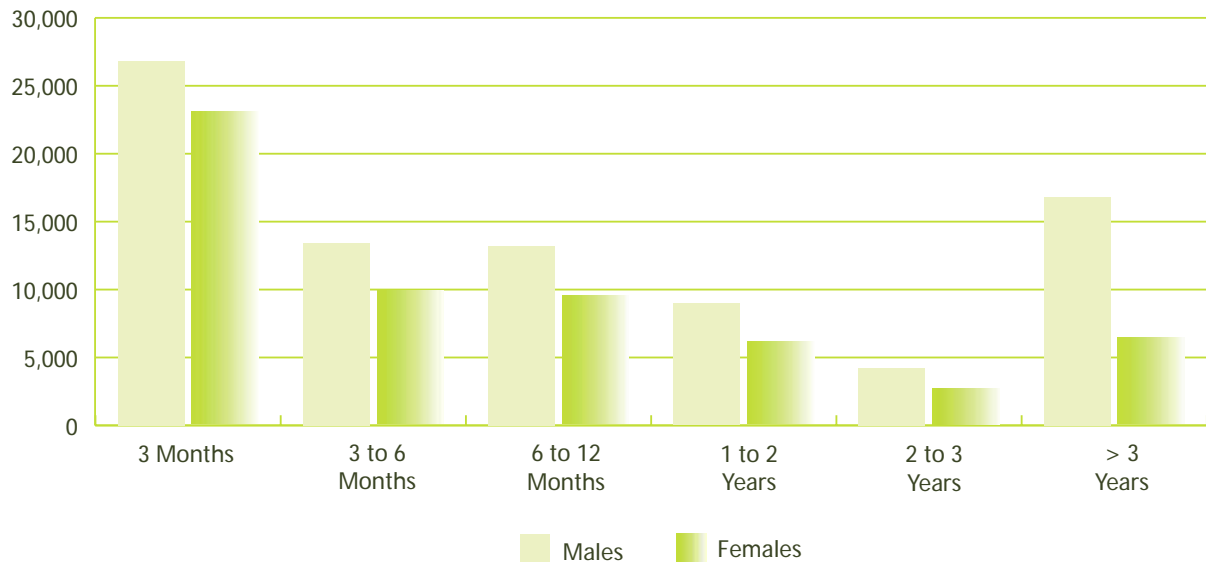

Section G: Employment Supports

The statistics in this section of the report relate to expenditure and recipients of a range of Employment Supports provided by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. These include:

- Family Income Supplement
- Back to Work Allowance
- Back to Work Enterprise Allowance
- Back to Education Allowance
- Part Time Job Incentive Scheme
- Farm Assist
- Student Summer Job Scheme

Time series and Existing Payments

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaced the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance Scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999 and 2000. There were 8,380 recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders at the end of 2001, of which 88 continued to be in receipt of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in this Section. Expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance is contained in Section F (Unemployment Supports). This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section F.

Trends

Overall expenditure on Employment Supports decreased by €1.5million in 2001, a decrease of 0.6% over 2000. The total number of recipients of Employment Supports decreased by 8,251, a decrease of 12.7%.

Expenditure on Family Income Supplement decreased by 5.8%. The number of recipients of Family Income Supplement decreased by 1,492, a decrease of 11.4% over 2000. Expenditure on Back to Work Allowance (including Back to Work Enterprise Allowance) decreased by over €10m, a decrease of 6.1%. The number of recipients of Back to Work Allowance decreased by 6,023, a decrease of 17.5%. The number of recipients of Back to Work Enterprise Allowance decreased by 795, a decrease of 17.7%. The number of recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders increased by 329, an increase on 4.1% over the previous year.

Expenditure on the Students Summer Jobs Scheme declined by 8.3% over 2000 reflecting the decline of 913 in the number of students who participated in the scheme.

Section H: Supplementary Welfare Allowance

This Section relates to payments made under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance Scheme, and includes

- Basic Payments
- Rent and Mortgage Interest Supplements
- Heating and Diet Supplements
- Exceptional and Urgent Needs Payments
- The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Scheme.

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance amounted to over €363 million in 2001. This represents an increase of 23.3% on 2000. Expenditure on Rent Supplements rose by over €28 million in 2001, an increase of 19% and accounted for 49.3% of total Supplementary Welfare Allowance expenditure. The number of recipients of Rent Supplement was 45,028, an increase of 5.5% on 2000. Approximately 5,100 recipients of Rent Supplement were asylum seekers.

Expenditure on Mortgage Interest Supplements rose to over €6 million, an increase of 7.9%. The number of recipients fell to 4,064, a decrease of 4%.

In 2001, a Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance was paid in respect of 143,029 children, a decrease of 15,737, on 2000. Expenditure on the scheme decreased by 7% to just under €13 million.

Net expenditure on Basic Payments in 2001 was €114 million, an increase of 32.7% on 2000. Table H3 shows gross expenditure (€151 million) on Basic Payments in 2001. This represents the gross amount of expenditure on such payments before inter scheme adjustments and refunds have been taken into account. There were 29,167 recipients of Basic Payments at the end of 2001, an increase of over 4,000 (16.2%) on 2000, approximately.

Table H2 and Graph H1 shows expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance from 1992 to 2001.

Expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance, 1992 to 2001

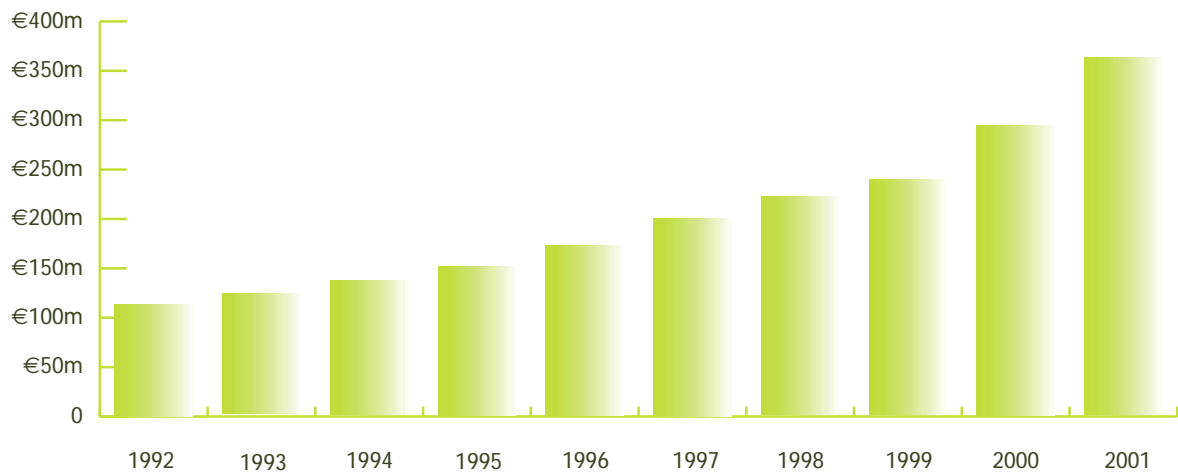

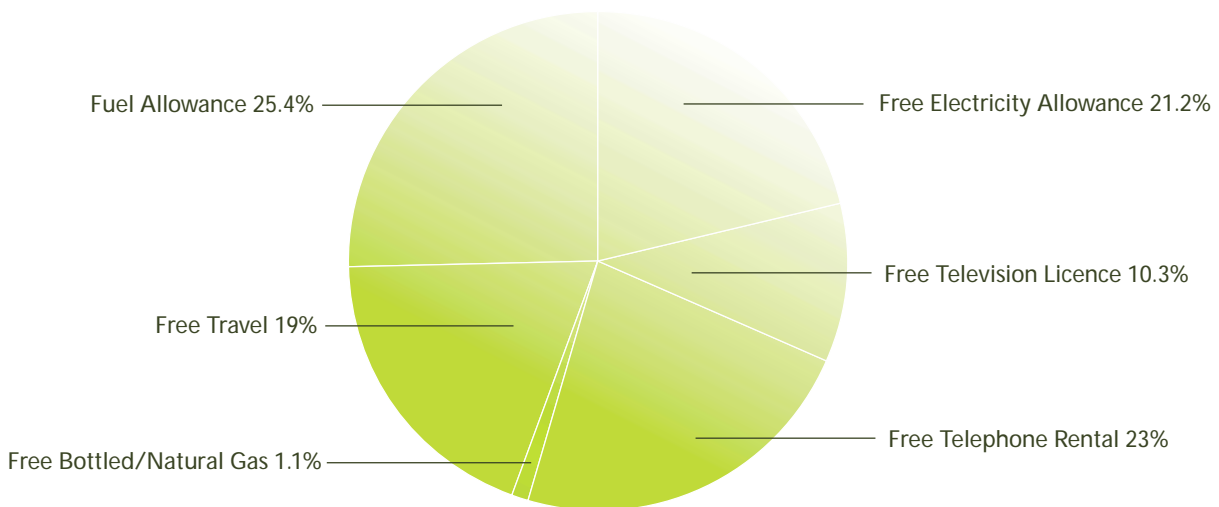

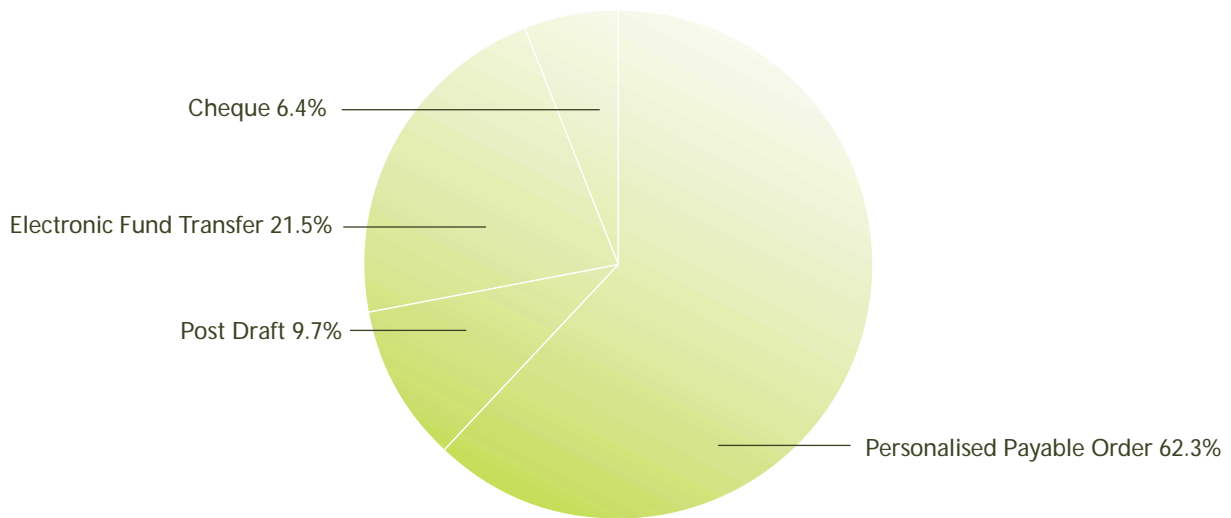

Appendix 1

SOCIAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Department of Social, Community & Family Affairs provides a range of payments which can be classified as follows.

SOCIAL INSURANCE

Payments made under the social insurance system are funded, in part, by contributions from employers, employees and the self-employed. Any deficit in the fund is met by Exchequer subvention. Entitlement to social insurance benefits is conditional upon the claimants having a certain number of contributions paid or credited in a specific period of time. The contributions conditions vary according to the different insurance schemes.

Social insurance schemes comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension, Widow's/ Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Carer's Benefit, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit, Widowed Parent Grant, Bereavement Grants and Free Schemes.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Social Assistance schemes are financed entirely by the Exchequer. One of the basic requirements to qualify for payment under the social assistance schemes is that the claimant must satisfy a means test.

Social Assistance schemes comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One-Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Rent Allowance and Free Schemes.

CHILD BENEFIT

Child Benefit is funded entirely by the Exchequer; it is payable in respect of all children regardless of family means.

Appendix 3

GLOSSARY

RECIPIENT:	Person actually receiving a social welfare payment.
QUALIFIED ADULT:	Person in respect of whom a Qualified Adult Allowance is paid to the recipient.
QUALIFIED CHILD:	Child in respect of whom a Qualified Child Increase is paid to the recipient. This allowance is payable at half the rate where a spouse/partner, living with the recipient, is not a Qualified Adult. Each spouse/partner may receive half the Qualified Child Increase where both are in receipt of a social welfare payment.
BENEFICIARIES:	Total of recipients, qualified adults and qualified children.
CLAIM/CLAIMANT:	An application/applicant for a social welfare payment.
SOCIAL INSURANCE PAYMENTS:	These comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Carer's Benefit, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit, Widowed Parent Grant, Bereavement Grants and Free Schemes.
SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS:	These comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One-Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Rent Allowance and Free Schemes.

Appendix 4

VOLUNTARY & COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs grant schemes concentrate on a wide range of support for local self-help groups, community development, welfare rights and information work, and on the provision of seed money to enable community groups to pilot initiatives identified as meeting new and emerging community needs. To be eligible for funding, groups must subscribe to a self-help, community ethos and must involve the intended beneficiaries in the management and the design of the project. These grant schemes are aimed at developing people and their capacity to participate in society, rather than the provision of services or direct economic development or job creation initiatives.

ISLAND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

A programme of core funding to five off-shore islands, Inishboffin, Inishturk, Sherkin, Clare Island and Bere Island, which is geared towards the specific needs of island communities and is funded under the Community Development Programme.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE

The aim of a Family and Community Services Resource Centre is to help combat disadvantage by improving the functioning of the family unit. Centres can provide special services for lone parent families, young mothers and others considered in need of extra support and can act as a first step to community participation and social inclusion for the most vulnerable and marginalised families. Centres are also concerned with initiatives to enhance their parenting skills and initiatives to promote the greater involvement of young men in the life of the community.

Legislation to establish the Family Support Agency was passed in late 2001 and it is intended that the agency will be established by mid-2002. Responsibility for the administration of the Family and Community Services Resource Centre Programme will transfer to the new Agency when it has been established.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The programme provides financial assistance to projects towards the staffing and equipping of local resource centres which provide a focal point for community development activities and to other specialised community development projects and initiatives having a strategic importance. The projects provide a range of supports, development opportunities and services to community groups and individuals within their areas.

MONEY ADVICE AND BUDGETING SERVICE

At the end of 2001, the Departments Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) supported 52 projects around the country which address the problems of moneylending and overindebtedness.

Appendix 5

Family Affairs Unit

Family Affairs Unit was established in the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs in 1998. The responsibilities of the Unit are;

- to co-ordinate family policy;
- to pursue the findings in the Report of the Commission on the Family following their consideration by the Government;
- to undertake research and promote awareness about family;
- support for the marriage and child and bereavement counselling services;
- the Family Mediation Service;
- an information programme on parenting issues.

Family Support Agency

Legislation to establish the Family Support Agency was enacted in December 2001. The Family Support Agency, which will be established in 2002, will have responsibility for a number of functions currently under the remit of the Family Affairs Unit. The new Agency will:

- provide a family mediation service;
- support, promote and develop the provision of marriage and relationship counselling and other family supports; and
- support, promote and develop the Family and Community Services Resource Centres programme.

The new Agency will undertake research, provide and disseminate information about parenting and family issues and provide advice to the Minister for Social, Community and Family Affairs on matters relating to its functions.

The Family Support Agency will bring together the main programmes and pro-family services developed since 1997. It will provide a comprehensive and coherent response for families in need of these support services and for families generally. It will be a dedicated Agency and a resource for all those involved in the promotion of family well being.
