Foreword from the Minister



I welcome the publication of the 2000 Annual Statistical Report, the eighteenth edition of this Report. It provides comprehensive statistical information on all Social Welfare Services operated by this Department as well as trends over the past ten years.

The Department is central to the provision of social protection in this country. The broad range of schemes and services it operates benefit individuals, families as well as the wider community. The Report will be of significant value in the development, both internally in the Department and externally, of policies responsive to the needs of people in a wide variety of circumstances.

The changing social and economic environment over recent years within which the Department operates is also reflected in the Report. Important developments in 2000 highlighted in the Report include:

- Substantial overall annual resources (nearly £5.3 billion) were made available in 2000 to finance Social Welfare services generally. The expenditure of the Department comprises 26% of total Gross Government Expenditure.
- The introduction of a new Carer's Benefit which facilitates persons who are required to leave work in order to provided care for sick or incapacitated persons
- The introduction of Widowed Parent Grants to assist widowed parents with dependant children,
- Improved levels of supports for people with disabilities, carers, pensioners and children.
- Major reductions in expenditure on Unemployment Supports in recent years reflecting the dramatic decreases in the Live Register.
- Ongoing significant expenditure on a comprehensive range of schemes designed to help those on low incomes and to facilitate entry or re-entry into the workforce,

I am committed to the ongoing maintenance and development of social services as the cornerstone of a socially inclusive society for everybody. Timely and accurate information is a key input to this process and this Report makes an important contribution in this regard.

Finally, I would like to thank the wide range of staff in the Department who contributed to the compilation of this Report.

General

This is the eighteenth issue of the annual "Statistical Information on Social Welfare Services" prepared by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. It sets out comprehensive data relating to services provided by the Department.

The statistics set out in this report relate to 2000 and earlier years. In the case of data relating to recipients and beneficiaries, the figures, unless otherwise stated, refer to the 31st December each year. Several tables, which provide a breakdown of recipients or beneficiaries by some characteristic such as number of dependants or age, are referred to as "estimated". This means that the proportionate breakdown, which is considered to be a reliable estimate, was established at a date other than, but close to. 31st December.

Expenditure figures for 2000 are provisional pending certification by the Comptroller and Auditor General.

Source of Data

The source for the statistics presented, unless otherwise stated, is the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments

Time Series data are given, where available. However, the introduction of new payments and changes to existing payments affect the comparability of different years' figures in some instances. Relevant tables are footnoted where appropriate.

Section D provides details of expenditure and recipients of child related payments including Child Benefit, Orphan's Pensions and Maternity Benefit.

Section E provides details of expenditure and recipients of Disability Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Carer's Benefit, Carer's Allowance and Occupational Injury Benefits.

Section F provides details of unemployment payments.

Section G provides details of employment supports including Back to Work Allowance, Back to Work Enterprise Allowance, Back to Education Allowance, the Student's Summer Jobs Scheme, Family Income Supplement and Farm Assist.

Section H provides details of the range of payments available under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance scheme.

Section J provides details of Treatment Benefits, Free Schemes and other miscellaneous payments. In addition this section includes information on the Voluntary and Community Services as well as the Family Services administered by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

New Payments

A Widowed Parent Grant was introduced at the end of December 1999 and payments commenced in early 2000. This grant is a once-off payment of £1,000 and is payable in respect of bereavements which occurred on or after 1 December 1999. The grant applies to widows and widowers with dependent children who qualify for a Widow/er's Contributory Pension, a One-Parent Family Payment or a Bereavement Grant.

Carer's Benefit was introduced in October 2000. The payment is social insured based and provides a weekly income maintenance payment to eligible persons who wish to leave the workforce in order to care for ill or incapacitated persons who are in need of full time care and attention. Carer's Benefit may be payable for up to 15 months in respect of any one care recipient.

Summary

A Social, Community and Family Affairs Leaflet to complement this report has been published. It contains, in summary form, details of expenditure and recipient numbers along with the social welfare payment rates applicable from April 2001.

Section A: Summary and Financial

Expenditure

Total Social Welfare expenditure in 2000 was £5,287 million, an increase of 6.9% over 1999. Expenditure in 2000 represented 25.9% of Gross Current Government expenditure and was equivalent to 7.8% of GNP (Table A2). The main areas of expenditure by programme group were Old Age (25.4%), Widow's, Widower's and One Parent Families (18.9%), Illness, Disability and Caring (15.6%), Unemployment Supports (10.9%), Child Related Payments (10.5%), Supplementary Welfare Allowance (4.4%), and Employment Supports (4.2%). Administration of the social welfare system accounted for 4.8% of total expenditure (Graph A1).

Total Social Welfare expenditure was financed by the Exchequer (53%) and by the Social Insurance Fund (47%). The Social Insurance Fund was financed by Pay Related Social Insurance contributions from employers (74.5%), employees (19.7%), the self-employed (5.1%) and investment income (0.7%). See Table A7 and Graph A3.

Recipients of Weekly Social Welfare Payments

Almost 870,000 people were in receipt of a weekly social welfare payment at the end of 2000. As these payments included increases in respect of almost 128,000 Qualified Adults and nearly 404,000 Children, there were nearly 1,433,000 beneficiaries in all. The number of recipients and beneficiaries decreased by 10,764 and 43,314 respectively, year on year.

Expenditure on Social Welfare by Programme, 2000









Section B: Old Age

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Old Age payments was over £1,344 million in 2000. This represents an increase of 11.9% on 1999.

The overall number of Old Age payments rose by 6,479 in 2000, an increase of 2.5%. The number of people in receipt of a contributory pension (Old Age Contributory Pension and Retirement Pension) based on social insurance contributions rose by 9,478 while the number of people in receipt of the means tested Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 2,371. The number of persons in receipt of Pre-Retirement Allowance fell by 628 in 2000.

Over the last ten years, the number of recipients of Old Age (Contributory) Pension rose by 13,453 and the number of recipients of Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 25,298. On the other hand, the number of recipients of Retirement Pension increased by 26,134, and the number of recipients of Pre-Retirement Allowance has increased by 3,080 in the same period. Section C: Widows, Widowers and One Parent Families

New Payment

A Widowed Parent Grant was introduced at the end of December 1999 and payments commenced in early 2000. This grant is a once-off payment of £1,000 and is payable in respect of bereavements which occurred on or after 1 December 1999. The grant applies to widows and widowers with dependent children who qualify for a Widow/er's Contributory Pension, a One-Parent Family Payment or a Bereavement Grant.

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Widows, Widowers and One Parent Families increased by 8.6% overall. The largest percentage increase (10.3%) was in expenditure on One Parent Family Payment, representing an increase of over £35 million. There were 74,119 recipients of this payment at the end of 2000, an increase of 5.3% over 1999.

The payment in this programme group with both the largest expenditure and number of recipients is Widow's and Widower's (Contributory) Pension. At the end of 2000, there were 100,374 recipients (90,793 widows and 9,581 widowers). Expenditure in 2000 was over £470 million which represented an increase of 9% over 1999.

The number of recipients of Deserted Wife's Benefit and Deserted Wife's Allowance declined during 2000. This arises as a result of the discontinuation of these payments for new claimants with effect from January 1997. One Parent Family Payment replaced these payments, Prisoners Wife's Allowance and Lone Parent's Allowance from that date.

Number of Recipients of One-Parent Family Payment by Age and Sex, 2000



Section D: Child Related Payments

Expenditure and Recipients

This section relates to payments made in respect of children such as Child Benefit, Orphan's Pensions, and Maternity related payments. For ease of reference, this section also gives details of increases in respect of qualified children which are payable with social welfare payments (See Table D10). It should be noted, however, that for the purpose of apportioning expenditure between programmes, the cost of qualified child increases are included with the main payment (e.g. Qualified Child increases paid with Old Age pensions are included in the 'Old Age' programme).

Expenditure on payments in this programme group rose by 12.9% in 2000. The breakdown of Child Benefit by family size shows that 73.4% of recipient families in 2000 have either one or two children. The equivalent percentage for 1992 was 65%. See Table D8 and Graph D1. The number of families receiving Child Benefit rose by 2,336 to 510,840. However, the total number of children in respect of whom Child Benefit is paid declined by 10,702 to 1,018,175.

Expenditure on Child Benefit increased by £57 million in 2000, an increase of 12.8% while Maternity Benefit expenditure increased by over £4 million, an increase of 10%.

Number of Families Receiving Child Benefit by number of Child Beneficiaries, 1992 to 2000



Section E: Illness, Disability and Caring

Expenditure and Recipients

Overall expenditure on Illness, Disability and Caring Payments increased by over £89 million, an increase of 12.1% over 1999. Expenditure on Disability Benefit and Invalidity Pension increased by 6.9% and 11.4% respectively. Disability Allowance was introduced in October 1996 and replaced Disabled Persons Maintenance Allowance (DPMA) which was administered by the Health Boards. Expenditure on Disability Allowance increased by 13.9% to £220 million. There are now 54,303 recipients of the scheme.

Carer's Allowance was introduced in October 1990. Expenditure on Carer's Allowance increased by £21 million in 2000, an increase of 36.6%. There are now 16,478 recipients of the scheme, an increase of 2,091 year on year.

Graph E1 and Table E4 show details of the numbers of Carer's Allowance recipients from 1991 to 2000.

New Payment

A new Carer's Benefit scheme was introduced in October 2000. Carer's Benefit is a payment made to insured persons who leave the workforce to care for a person(s) who require full time care and attention





Section F: Unemployment Supports

The statistics in this section of the report relate to the Live Register, expenditure and recipients of unemployment payments;

Live Register and Unemployment Payments

The Live Register is a monthly statistical count complied by the Central Statistics Office of certain categories of persons registered with the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs for Unemployment Benefit, Unemployment Assistance and credited Social Insurance contributions.

The Live Register comprises of the following classes of persons under the age of 65 years:

- · all claimants of Unemployment Benefit excluding systematic short-time workers,
- · applicants for Unemployment Assistance excluding smallholders and self-employed persons,
- other registrants including applicants for credited Social Welfare contributions but excluding those directly involved in an industrial dispute.

This means that not all persons who are in receipt of Unemployment Benefit or Assistance are on the Live Register. Some persons who are included on the Live Register e.g. applicants for credited contributions, are not in receipt of an unemployment benefit or assistance payment.

Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaced the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999 and 2000. There were 750 recipients of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance at the end of 1999 and 163 at the end of December 2000.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in Section G (Employment Supports). Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance shown in this Section includes expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance in 2000, 1999, and earlier years. This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section G.

Trends

Overall expenditure on Unemployment Supports decreased by over 19% over 1999.

Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance fell by over £115 million over 1999, a decrease of 23.8%. Expenditure on Unemployment Benefit fell by over £22 million, a decrease of 9.7% over 1999.

These decreases reflect the fall in the numbers on these payments, including those on the Live Register. The Live Register declined by 34,953 during 2000, a decrease of 19.8%. Table F14 shows the numbers on the Live Register by County in 1999 and 2000 and the percentage decrease in each county.





Number of persons on the Live Register in October 2000, by Sex and Duration



Section G: Employment Supports

The statistics in this section of the report relate to expenditure and recipients of a range of Employment Supports provided by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. These include:

- Family Income Supplement
- Back to Work Enterprise Allowance
- · Part Time Job Incentive Scheme
- Student Summer Job Scheme

- Back to Work Allowance
- · Back to Education Allowance
- Farm Assist

Time series and Existing Payments

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaced the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance Scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999 and 2000. There were 8,051 recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders at the end of 2000, of which 163 continued to be in receipt of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in this Section. Expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance is contained in Section F (Unemployment Supports). This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section F.

Trends

Overall expenditure on Employment Supports increased by nearly £27million in 2000, an increase of 13.6% over 1999. The total number of recipients of Employment Supports decreased by 287, a decrease of 0.4%.

Expenditure on Family Income Supplement decreased by 4.3%. The number of recipients of Family Income Supplement decreased by 1,487, a decrease of 10.2% over 1999. Expenditure on Back to Work Allowance (including Back to Work Enterprise Allowance) increased by nearly £10m, an increase of 8%. The number of recipients of Back to Work Allowance increased by 2,575, an increase of 8.1%. The number of recipients of Back to Work Enterprise Allowance decreased by 1,178, a decrease of 20.7%. The number of recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders increased by 177, an increase on 2.2% over the previous year.

Expenditure on the Students Summer Jobs Incentive Scheme declined by 34.8% over 1999 reflecting the decline of 3,322 in the number of students who participated in the scheme.

Expenditure on Employment Supports, 1991 to 2000



Supplementary Welfare Allowance

Section H: Supplementary Welfare Allowance

This Section relates to payments made under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance Scheme, and includes

- · Basic Payments
- Rent and Mortgage Interest Supplements
- Heating and Diet Supplements
- Exceptional and Urgent Needs Payments
- The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Scheme.

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance amounted to over £232 million in 2000. This represents an increase of 17.7% on 1999, having excluded balances held by Health Boards in that year. Expenditure on Rent Supplements rose by over £18 million in 2000, an increase of 18% and accounted for 51.1% of total Supplementary Welfare Allowance expenditure. The number of recipients of Rent Supplement was 42,683, an increase of 1.9% on 1999. Approximately 4,700 recipients of Rent Supplement were asylum seekers.

Expenditure on Mortgage Interest Supplements fell to under £5 million, a decrease of 28.2%. The number of recipients fell to 4,233, a decrease of 20.7%.

In 2000, a Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance was paid in respect of 158,766 children, a decrease of 24,942, on 1999. Expenditure on the scheme increased by 19.1% to just under £11 million.

Net expenditure on Basic Payments in 2000 was £67.5 million, an increase of 26.2% on 1999. Table H3 shows gross expenditure (£93.3 million) on Basic Payments in 2000. This represents the gross amount of expenditure on such payments before inter scheme adjustments and refunds have been taken into account. There were 25,094 recipients of Basic Payments at the end of 2000, an increase of nearly 4,000 (18%) on 1999.

Table H2 and Graph H1 shows expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance from 1991 to 2000.







SOCIAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Department of Social, Community & Family Affairs provides a range of payments which can be classified as follows.

SOCIAL INSURANCE

Payments made under the social insurance system are funded by contributions from employers, employees and the self-employed. Any deficit in the fund is met by Exchequer subvention. Entitlement to social insurance benefits is conditional upon the claimants having a certain number of contributions paid or credited in a specific period of time. The contributions conditions vary according to the different insurance schemes.

Social insurance schemes comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Carer's Benefit, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit, Widowed Parent Grant, Bereavement Grants and Free Schemes.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Social Assistance schemes are financed entirely by the Exchequer. One of the basic requirements to qualify for payment under the social assistance schemes is that the claimant must satisfy a means test.

Social Assistance schemes comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Rent Allowance and Free Schemes.

CHILD BENEFIT

Child Benefit is funded entirely by the Exchequer; it is payable in respect of all children regardless of family means.

GLOSSARY

RECIPIENT: Person actually receiving a social welfare payment.

the recipient. This allowance is payable at half the rate where a spouse/partner, living with the recipient, is not a Qualified Adult. Each spouse/partner may receive half the Qualified Child Increase where both are in receipt of a social welfare

BENEFICIARIES: Total of recipients, qualified adults and qualified children.

CLAIM/CLAIMANT: An application/applicant for a social welfare payment.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS: These comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension,

Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income

Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Rent Allowance and Free Schemes.

VOLUNTARY & COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs grant schemes concentrate on a wide range of support for local self-help groups, community development, welfare rights and information work, and on the provision of seed money to enable community groups to pilot initiatives identified as meeting new and emerging community needs. To be eligible for funding, groups must subscribe to a self-help, community ethos and must involve the intended beneficiaries in the management and the design of the project. These grant schemes are aimed at developing people and their capacity to participate in society, rather than the provision of services or direct economic development or job creation initiatives.

ISLAND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

A programme of core funding to five off-shore islands, Inishboffin, Inishturk, Sherkin, Clare Island and Bere Island, which is geared towards the specific needs of island communities and is funded under the Community Development Programme.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE

The aim of a Family and Community Services Resource Centre is to help combat disadvantage by improving the functioning of the family unit. Centres can provide special services for lone parent families, young mothers and others considered in need of extra support and can act as a first step to community participation and social inclusion for the most vulnerable and marginalised families. Centres are also concerned with initiatives to enhance their parenting skills and initiatives to promote the greater involvement of young men in the life of the community.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The programme provides financial assistance to projects towards the staffing and equipping of local resource centres which provide a focal point for community development activities and to other specialised community development projects and initiatives having a strategic importance. The projects provide a range of supports, development opportunities and services to community groups and individuals within their areas.

MONEY ADVICE AND BUDGETING SERVICE

At the end of 2000, the Department's Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) supported 50 projects around the country which address the problems of moneylending and overindebtedness.

Family Affairs Unit

The Family Affairs Unit was established in the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs in 1998. The role of the unit is to co-ordinate family policy, pursue the findings of the Commission on the Family's final report following their consideration by the Government, to undertake research, and promote awareness about family issues.

The Unit has responsibility for a number of family services including the provision of grant aid to support activity in the areas of :-

- Marriage Counselling
- Marriage Preparation Courses
- Child Counselling in relation to parental separation
- Bereavement Counselling and Support on the death of a family member

The Unit also has responsibility for the Family Mediation Service as well as a number of other family services, including a pilot programme to improve services to families from local offices of the Department through the one-stop shop model, and the introduction of an information programme on parenting issues in consultation with the Department of Health and Children.
