#### General

This is the seventeenth issue of the annual "Statistical Information on Social Welfare Services" prepared by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. It sets out comprehensive data relating to services provided by the Department.

The statistics set out in this report relate to 1999 and earlier years. In the case of data relating to recipients and beneficiaries, the figures, unless otherwise stated, refer to the 31st December each year. Several tables, which provide a breakdown of recipients or beneficiaries by some characteristic such as number of dependants or age, are referred to as "estimated". This means that the proportionate breakdown, which is considered to be a reliable estimate, was established at a date other than, but close to, 31st December.

Expenditure figures for 1999 are provisional pending certification by the Comptroller and Auditor General.

#### Source of Data

The source for the statistics presented, unless otherwise stated, is the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

**Section J** provides details of Treatment Benefits, Free Schemes and other miscellaneous payments. In addition this section includes information on the Voluntary and Community Services as well as the Family Services administered by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

#### **New Payments**

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaces the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999. Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in Section G (Employment Supports). Data on expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance is shown in Section F (Unemployment Supports).

#### **Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments**

Time Series data are given, where available. However, the introduction of new payments e.g. Farm Assist and changes to existing payments affect the comparability of different years' figures in some instances. Relevant tables are footnoted where appropriate.

#### **Summary**

A Social, Community and Family Affairs Leaflet to complement this report has been published. It contains, in summary form, details of expenditure and recipient numbers along with the social welfare payment rates applicable from May 2000.

# Section A: Summary and Financial

#### **Expenditure**

Total Social Welfare expenditure in 1999 was £4,948 million, an increase of 3.9% over 1998. Expenditure in 1999 represented 26% of Gross Current Government expenditure and was equivalent to 8.5% of GNP (Table A2). The main areas of expenditure by programme group were Old Age (24.3%), Widow's, Widower's and One Parent Families (18.6%), Unemployment Supports (14.5%), Employment Supports (4.0%), Child Related Payments (9.9%), Illness, Disability and Caring (14.9%) and Supplementary Welfare Allowance (3.8%). Administration of the social welfare system accounted for 4.9% of total expenditure (Graph A1).

Total Social Welfare expenditure was financed by the Exchequer (54.7%) and by the Social Insurance Fund (45.3%). The Social Insurance Fund was financed by Pay Related Social Insurance contributions from employers (74%), employees (20%) and the self-employed (6%). See Table A7 and Graph A3.

#### **Recipients of Weekly Social Welfare Payments**

Almost 881,000 people were in receipt of a weekly social welfare payment at the end of 1999. As these payments included increases in respect of over 130,000 Qualified Adults and nearly 465,000 Children, there were over 1,476,000 beneficiaries in all. The number of recipients and beneficiaries increased by 2,509 and 592 respectively, year on year.

#### Expenditure on Social Welfare by Programme, 1999



Financing of the Social Insurance Fund, 1999





#### Analysis of Insured Population, 1998/99



# section old age

Expenditure on Old Age payments was over £1,201 million in 1999. This represents an increase of 7.0% on 1998.

The overall number of Old Age payments rose by 4,472 in 1999, an increase of 1.7%. The number of people in receipt of a contributory pension (Old Age Contributory Pension and Retirement Pension) based on social insurance contributions rose by 8,087 while the number of people in receipt of the means tested Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 2,867. The number of persons in receipt of Pre-Retirement Allowance fell by 748 in 1999.

Over the last ten years, the number of recipients of Old Age (Contributory) Pension rose by 1,771 and the number of recipients of Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 25,200. On the other hand, the number of recipients of Retirement Pension increased by 30,393 in the same period. Pre-Retirement Allowance was introduced in March 1990 and the number of recipients has increased by 7,045 since then. See Table B3 and Graph B1 for details.

#### Number of Recipients of Old Age Pensions, 1990 to 1999



# Section C: Widows, Widowers and One-Parent Families

#### **Expenditure and Recipients**

Expenditure on Widows, Widowers and One Parent Families increased by 7.1% overall. The largest percentage increase (11.6%) was in expenditure on One-Parent Family Payment, representing an increase of over £35 million. There were 70,387 recipients of this payment at the end of 1999, an increase of 7.4% over 1998.

The payment in this programme group with both the largest expenditure and number of recipients is Widow's and Widower's (Contributory) Pension. At the end of 1999, there were 99,771 recipients (90,758 widows and 9,013 widowers). Expenditure in 1999 was over £431 million which represented an increase of 5.9% over 1998.

Expenditure on Deserted Wife's Benefit and Deserted Wife's Allowance declined during 1999 as did the number of recipients. This arises as a result of the discontinuation of these payments for new claimants with effect from January 1997. One Parent Family Payment replaced these payments, Prisioners Wife's Allowance and Lone Parent's Allowance from that date.

Number of Recipients of One-Parent Family Payment by Age and Sex, 1999



#### **Section D : Child Related Payments**

#### **Expenditure and Recipients**

This section relates to payments made in respect of children such as Child Benefit, Orphan's Pensions, and Maternity related payments. For ease of reference, this section also gives details of increases in respect of qualified children which are payable with social welfare payments (See Table D10). It should be noted, however, that for the purpose of apportioning expenditure between programmes, the cost of qualified child increases are included with the main payment e.g. Qualified Child increases paid with Old Age pensions are included in the 'Old Age' programme.

Expenditure on payments in this programme group rose by 6.6% in 1999. The breakdown of Child Benefit by family size shows that 72.4% of recipient families in 1999 have either one or two children. The equivalent percentage for 1992 was 65%. See Table D8 and Graph D1. The number of families receiving Child Benefit rose by 3,693 to 508,504. However, the total number of children in respect of whom Child Benefit is paid declined by 10,869 to 1,028,877.

Expenditure on Child Benefit increased by £26 million in 1999, an increase of 6.3% while Maternity Benefit expenditure increased by over £3 million, an increase of 8.7%.

Data on Back to School Clothing and Footwear which previously appeared in this section is now in Section H (Supplementary Welfare Allowance).

### Number of Families Receiving Child Benefit by number of Child Beneficiaries, 1991 to 1999



#### Section E: Illness, Disability and Caring

#### **Expenditure and Recipients**


Expenditure on Disability Benefit and Invalidity Pension increased by 8.8% and 5.8% respectively. Disability Allowance was introduced in October 1996 and replaced Disabled Persons Maintenance Allowance (DPMA) which was administered by the Health Boards. Expenditure on Disability Allowance increased by 11.9% to £193 million. There are now 50,431 recipients of the scheme.

Carer's Allowance was introduced in October 1990. Expenditure on Carer's Allowance increased by £12.3 million in 1999, an increase of 27.3%. There are now 14,387 recipients of the Scheme, an increase of 2,971 year on year.

Graph E1 and Table E4 show details of the numbers of Carer's Allowance recipients from 1991 to 1999.

#### **Section F: Unemployment Supports**

The statistics in this section of the report relate to the Live Register, expenditure and recipients of unemployment payments.

#### **Live Register and Unemployment Payments**

The Live Register is a monthly statistical count complied by the Central Statistics Office of certain categories of persons registered with the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs for Unemployment Benefit, Unemployment Assistance and credited Social Insurance contributions.

The Live Register comprises of the following classes of persons under the age of 65 years:

- (i) all claimants of Unemployment Benefit excluding systematic short-time workers,
- (ii) applicants for Unemployment Assistance excluding smallholders and self-employed persons,
- (iii) other registrants, including applicants for credited Social Welfare contributions but excluding those directly involved in an industrial dispute.

This means that not all persons who are in receipt of Unemployment Benefit or Assistance are on the Live Register. Some persons who are included on the Live Register e.g. applicants for credited contributions, are not in receipt of an unemployment benefit or assistance payment.

#### **Changes to Existing Payments**

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaces the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999. There were 7,874 recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders at the end of 1999, of which 750 continued to be in receipt of Smallholders Unemployment Assistance.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in Section G (Employment Supports). Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance shown in this Section includes expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance in 1999 and earlier years. This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section G.

#### **Trends**

Overall expenditure on Unemployment Supports decreased by 15% over 1998. Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance fell by nearly £122 million over 1998, a decrease of 20.1%. Expenditure on Unemployment Benefit fell by over £5 million, a decrease of 2.2% over 1998.

These decreases reflect the fall in the numbers on these payments, including those on the Live Register. The Live Register declined by 33,586 during 1999, a decrease of 14.8%

# Expenditure on Unemployment Benefit/Pay Related Benefit and Unemployment Assistance, 1990 -1999









# **Section G: Employment Supports**

The statistics in this section of the report relate to expenditure and recipients of a range of Employment Supports provided by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. These include:

- Family Income Supplement
- Back to Work Allowance
- Back to Work Enterprise Allowance
- Back to Education Allowance
- Student Summer Job Scheme
- Part-Time Job Incentive Scheme
- Farm Assist

### **New Payment**

Farm Assist was introduced in April 1999 and replaces the Smallholders Unemployment Assistance Scheme. The new scheme provides an income supplement for low-income farmers. The great majority of existing recipients of Smallholders Assistance transferred to Farm Assist during the course of 1999. There were 7,874 recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders at the end of 1999, of which 750 continued to be in receipt of Smallholders Assistance.

Data on expenditure on Farm Assist and recipients of Farm Assist/Smallholders is contained in this Section. Expenditure on Smallholders Unemployment Assistance is contained in Section F (Unemployment Supports). This affects the comparability of different years' figures in this Section and in Section F.

### **Trends**

Overall expenditure on Employment Supports increased by £40million in 1999, an increase of 25.4% over 1998. The total number of recipients of Employment Supports increased by 8,899 an increase of over 15%.

Expenditure on Family Income Supplement increased by 13.1%. The number of recipients of Family Income Supplement increased by 1,406 an increase of 10.7%. Expenditure on Back to Work Allowance increased by nearly £22million, an increase of 32%, reflecting an increase of 7,803 in the number of recipients. Expenditure on Back to Education Allowance increased by 21.7%.

Meanwhile, expenditure on Back to Work Enterprise Allowance decreased by 5.7% in 1999 and the number of recipients of this scheme has declined by 1,750 to 5,681. Expenditure on the Students Summer Jobs Scheme declined by 33.7% over 1998 reflecting the decline of 4,419 in the number of students who participated in the scheme.



# Section H: Supplementary Welfare Allowance

This Section relates to payments made under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance Scheme, and includes

- Basic Payments
- Rent and Mortgage Interest Supplements
- Heating and Diet Supplements
- Exceptional and Urgent Needs Payments
- The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Scheme.

# **Expenditure and Recipients**

Expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance amounted to almost £189 million in 1999 and represents an increase of 7.5% on 1998. Expenditure on Rent Supplements rose by over £12 million in 1999, an increase of 14.3% and accounted for 53.3% of total Supplementary Welfare Allowance expenditure. The number of recipients of Rent Supplement was 41,873, an increase of 4.7% on 1998. Approximately 4,500 recipients of Rent Supplement were asylum seekers.

Expenditure on Mortgage Interest Supplements fell to just over £6 million, a decrease of 29.1%. The number of recipients fell to 5,108, a decrease of 23.3%.

In 1999 a Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance was paid in respect of 183,708 children, a decrease of 25,592 on 1998. Expenditure on the scheme fell by 11.9% to just over £9 million.

Net expenditure on Basic Payments in 1999 was £53.3 million, an increase of 34.1% on 1998. Table H3 shows gross expenditure (£73.6 million) on Basic Payments in 1999. This represents the gross amount of expenditure on such payments before inter scheme adjustments and refunds have been taken into account. There were 21,269 recipients of Basic Payments at the end of 1999, an increase of nearly 6,000 (30.5%) on 1998. Approximately 6,600 recipients of Basic Payments were asylum seekers.

Table H2 and Graph H1 shows expenditure on Supplementary Welfare Allowance from 1990 to 1999.







### SOCIAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs provides a range of payments which can be classified as follows.

### **SOCIAL INSURANCE**

Payments made under the social insurance system are funded, in part, by contributions from employers, employees and the self-employed. Any deficit in the fund is met by Exchequer subvention. Entitlement to social insurance benefits is conditional upon the claimants having a certain number of contributions paid or credited in a specific period of time. The contributions conditions vary according to the different insurance schemes.

Social insurance schemes comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit and Bereavement Grants.

### **SOCIAL ASSISTANCE**

Social Assistance schemes are financed entirely by the Exchequer. One of the basic requirements to qualify for payment under the social assistance schemes is that the claimant must satisfy a means test.

Social Assistance schemes comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One-Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension and Rent Allowance.

### **CHILD BENEFIT**

Child Benefit is funded entirely by the Exchequer; it is payable in respect of all children regardless of family means.

# **GLOSSARY**

**RECIPIENT:** Person actually receiving a social welfare payment.

QUALIFIED ADULT: Person in respect of whom an Qualified Adult Allowance is

paid to the recipient.

QUALIFIED CHILD: Child in respect of whom a Qualified Child Increase is paid to

the recipient. This allowance is payable at half the rate where a spouse/partner, living with the recipient, is not a Qualified Adult. Each spouse/partner may receive half the Qualified Child Increase where both are in receipt of a social welfare

payment.

BENEFICIARIES: Total of recipients, qualified adults and qualified children.

**CLAIM/CLAIMANT:** An application/applicant for a social welfare payment.

**SOCIAL INSURANCE PAYMENTS:** These comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement

Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension,

Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive

Benefit. Treatment Benefit and Bereavement Grants.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS: These comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension,

Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's

Wife's Allowance, One Parent Family Payment,

Unemployment Assistance, Farm Assist, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income

Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind

Person's Pension and Rent Allowance.

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### **VOLUNTARY & COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS**

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs grant schemes concentrate on a wide range of support for local self-help groups, community development, welfare rights and information work, and on the provision of seed money to enable community groups to pilot initiatives identified as meeting new and emerging community needs. To be eligible for funding, groups must subscribe to a self-help, community ethos and must involve the intended beneficiaries in the management and the design of the project. These grant schemes are aimed at developing people and their capacity to participate in society, rather than at the provision of services or at the direct economic development or job creation initiatives.

### ISLAND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

A programme of core funding to five off-shore islands, which is geared towards the specific needs of island communities, funded under the Community Development Programme.

### **FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE**

The aim of a Family and Community Services Resource Centre is to help combat disadvantage by improving the functioning of the family unit. Centres can provide special services for lone parent families, young mothers and others considered in need of extra support and can act as a first step to community participation and social inclusion for the most vulnerable and marginalised families. Centres are also concerned with initiatives to enhance their parenting skills and initiatives to promote the greater involvement of young men in the life of the community.

### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The programme provides financial assistance to projects towards the staffing and equipping of local resource centres which provide a focal point for community development activities in the area and to other specialised community developed projects and initiatives having a strategic importance. The projects provide a range of supports, development opportunities and services to community groups and individuals within their areas.

### MONEY ADVICE AND BUDGETING SERVICE

At the end of 1999, the Department's Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) supported 50 projects around the country which address the problems of moneylending and overindebtedness.

### **FAMILY AFFAIRS UNIT**

A new Family Affairs Unit was established in the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs in 1998. The role of the unit is to co-ordinate family policy, pursue the findings of the Commission on the Family's final report following their consideration by the Government, to undertake research, and promote awareness about family issues.

The Unit has responsibility for a number of family services including the provision of grant aid to support activity in the areas of :-

- Marriage Counselling
- Marriage Preparation Courses
- Child Counselling in relation to parental separation
- Bereavement Counselling and Support on the death of a family member

Voluntary organisations providing:-

- marriage counselling services helping people to deal with difficulties they experience in their relationships
- marriage preparation programmes
- counselling services to children whose lives have been affected by parental separation
- · bereavement counselling and support to families on the death of a family member

may apply for funding towards the cost of these services.

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
