introduction

General

This is the sixteenth issue of the annual "Statistical Information on Social Welfare Services" prepared by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs. It sets out comprehensive data relating to services provided by the Department.

The statistics set out in this report relate to 1998 and earlier years. In the case of data relating to recipients and beneficiaries, the figures, unless otherwise stated, refer to the 31st December each year. Several tables, which provide a breakdown of recipients or beneficiaries by some characteristic such as number of dependants or age, are referred to as "estimated". This means that the proportionate breakdown, which is considered to be a reliable estimate, was established at a date other than, but close to, 31st December.

Expenditure figures for 1998 are provisional pending certification by the Comptroller and Auditor General. In a limited number of tables recipient numbers for 1997 are shown as "estimated". This arose because of the introduction of new payment systems for schemes involved. The data shown is not a precise count of recipients but is nonetheless regarded as a reliable estimate and was established at a date other than 31st December, 1997.

Time Series and Changes to Existing Payments

Time Series data are given, where available. However, the introduction of new payments and changes to existing payments affect the comparability of different years' figures in some instances. Relevant tables are footnoted where appropriate.

Source of Data

The source for the statistics presented, unless otherwise stated, is the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

Section C provides details of expenditure and recipients of payments to widows, widowers and one parent families. It also includes some statistics on payment to deserted wives and prisoners' wives.

Section D provides details of expenditure and recipients of child related payments including Child Benefit, Orphan's Pensions and Maternity Benefit.

Section E provides details of expenditure and recipients of Disability Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Allowance, Blind Person's Pension, Carers Allowance and Occupational Injury Benefits.

Section F provides details of unemployment payments, Family Income Supplement and Employment Support Services.

Section G provides details of Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Treatment Benefits, Free Schemes and other miscellaneous payments (e.g. Death Grants, Living Alone Allowance etc.). In addition, this section includes information on the Voluntary and Community Services as well as the Family Services administered by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

Section H provides details of claimload, appeals and payment methods.

Summary

A Social, Community and Family Affairs Leaflet to complement this report has been published. It contains, in summary form, details of expenditure and recipient numbers along with the social welfare payment rates applicable from June 1999.

Section A: Summary and Financial

Expenditure

Total Social Welfare expenditure in 1998 was £4,763 million, an increase of 5.3% over 1997. Expenditure in 1998 represented 33.3% of Net Current Government expenditure and was equivalent to 8.8% of GDP (Table A2). The main areas of expenditure by programme group were Old Age (23.6%), Widow's, Widower's and One Parent Families (18.0%), Unemployment Support (17.7%), Employment Support (3.3%), Child Related Payments (9.7%) and Illness, Disability and Caring (14.1%). Administration of the social welfare system accounted for 4.9% of total expenditure (Graph A1).

Total Social Welfare expenditure was financed by the Exchequer (56%) and by the Social Insurance Fund (44%). The Social Insurance Fund was financed by Pay Related Social Insurance contributions from employers (71%), employees (23%) and the self-employed (6%). See Table A6 and Graph A2.

Recipients of Weekly Social Welfare Payments

Almost 854,000 people were in receipt of a weekly social welfare payment at the end of 1998. As these payments included increases in respect of over 120,000 Qualified Adults and over 440,000 Qualified Children, there were over 1.4 million beneficiaries in all. This represents a 2.0% decrease in the number of recipients since 1997 and a decrease of 2.9% in the number of beneficiaries over the same period (Graph A3).

Expenditure on Social Welfare by Programme, 1998



Financing of the Social Insurance Fund, 1998







Section B: Old Age

Expenditure and Recipients


Expenditure on Old Age payments was almost £1,123 million in 1998. This represents an increase of 8.4% on 1997.

The overall number of Old Age payments rose by 2,512 in 1998, an increase of 0.9%. The number of people in receipt of a contributory pension (Old Age Contributory Pension and Retirement Pension) based on social insurance contributions rose by 5,207 while the number of people in receipt of the means tested Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 2,945.

Over the last ten years, the number of recipients of both Old Age (Contributory) Pension and the Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension fell by 28,231 in total, 3,489 in the case of Old Age (Contributory) Pension and 24,742 in the case of Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension. On the other hand, the number of recipients of Retirement Pension increased by 29,904 in the same period. Pre-Retirement Allowance was introduced in March 1990 and the number of recipients has increased by 7,793 since then. See Table B3 and Graph B1 for details.

Section C: Widows, Widowers and One Parent **Families**

Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on Widows, Widowers and One-Parent Families increased by 8.9% overall. The largest percentage increase (15.2%) was in expenditure on One-Parent Family Payment, representing an increase of over £40 million. There were 65,548 recipients of this payment at the end of 1998, an increase of 11.2% over 1997.

The payment in this programme group with both the largest expenditure and number of recipients is Widow's and Widower's (Contributory) Pension. At the end of 1998, there were 98,518 recipients (90,080 widows and 8,438 widowers). Expenditure in 1998 was over £407 million which represented an increase of 8.1% over 1997.

Expenditure on Deserted Wife's Benefit, Deserted Wife's Allowance and Prisoner's Wife's Allowance declined during 1998 as did the number of recipients. This arises as a result of the discontinuation of these payments for new claimants with effect from January 1997. One-Parent Family Payment replaced these payments and Lone Parent's Allowance from that date.

Number of Recipients of One-Parent Family Payment by Age and Sex, 1998



Section D : Child Related Payments

Expenditure and Recipients

This section relates to payments made in respect of children such as Child Benefit, Orphan's Pensions, and Maternity related payments. For ease of reference, this section also gives details of increases in respect of qualified children which are payable with social welfare payments (See Table D13). It should be noted, however, that for the purpose of apportioning expenditure between programmes, the cost of qualified child increases are included with the main payment (e.g. Qualified Child increases paid with Old Age pensions are included in the 'Old Age' programme).

Expenditure on payments in this programme group rose by 5.8% in 1998. The breakdown of Child Benefit by family size shows that 71% of recipient families in 1998 have either one or two children. The equivalent percentage for 1992 was 65%. See Table D8 and Graph D1. The number of families receiving Child Benefit rose by 2,493 to 504,811. However, the total number of children in respect of whom Child Benefit is paid declined by 13,655 to 1,039,746.

Expenditure on Child Benefit increased by £20 million in 1998, an increase of 5.1% while Maternity Benefit expenditure increased by over £4 million, an increase of 12.2%.

Number of Families Receiving Child Benefit by Family Size, 1991 to 1998



Section E: Illness, Disability and Caring


Expenditure and Recipients

Expenditure on payments in the Illness, Disability and Caring programme increased by 8% in 1998. This was mainly due to increases in expenditure both in Disability Allowance and Carer's Allowance. Expenditure on Disability Allowance increased by 13.9% and the number of recipients increased by 9%. Expenditure on Carer's Allowance increased by 23.5% while the number of recipients increased by 12%.

Disability Allowance was introduced in October 1996 and replaced Disabled Person's Maintenance Allowance which was administered by the Health Boards. There are now 47,126 recipients of the scheme. Carer's Allowance was introduced in October 1990 and there are now 11,416 recipients of this scheme. Table E8 and Graph E1 show details of the numbers of Carer's Allowance recipients from 1991 to 1998.

Section F: Unemployment and Employment Supports

The statistics in this section of the report relate to:

- (i) the Live Register, expenditure and recipients of unemployment payments;
- (ii) expenditure and recipients of Family Income Support as well as details of the various Employment Support services provided by the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs.

Live Register and Unemployment Payments

The Live Register is a monthly statistical count complied by the Central Statistics Office of certain categories of persons registered with the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs for Unemployment Benefit, Unemployment Assistance and credited Social Insurance contributions.

The Live Register comprises of the following classes of persons under the age of 65 years:

- (i) all claimants of Unemployment Benefit excluding systematic short-time workers,
- (ii) applicants for Unemployment Assistance excluding smallholders and self-employed persons,
- (iii) other registrants including applicants for credited Social Welfare contributions but excluding those directly involved in an industrial dispute.

This means that not all persons who are in receipt of Unemployment Benefit or Assistance are on the Live Register. Some persons who are included on the Live Register e.g. applicants for credited contributions, are not in receipt of an unemployment benefit or assistance payment.

Trends

Overall expenditure on Unemployment and Employment Supports decreased by 4.4% over 1997.

Expenditure on Unemployment Support payments in 1998 decreased by almost £81 million. This represents a decrease of 8.7% over 1997. Expenditure on Unemployment Assistance decreased by 14.4% over 1997 (reflecting a fall in the numbers on these payments), while expenditure on Unemployment Benefit increased by 10%.

Expenditure on Employment Support payments increased by £34 million over 1997, an increase of 27.8%. Expenditure on schemes to encourage unemployed people to take up work, training and educational opportunities increased substantially with significant increases in expenditure on Back to Work Enterprise Allowance (127.8%), Back to Work Allowance (15.7%) and Back to Education Allowance (30.7%). Family Income Supplement expenditure increased by 10.3% over 1997. Expenditure on the Students Summer Jobs Incentive Scheme declined by 11.4% over 1997 reflecting the decline of 2,021 in the number of students who participated in the scheme.



Number of Persons on the Live Register by Age and Sex, 1998



Number of Persons on the Live Register in October 1998, by Sex and Duration





Appendix 1

SOCIAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs provides a range of payments which can be classified as follows.

SOCIAL INSURANCE

Payments made under the social insurance system are funded, in part, by contributions from employers, employees and the self-employed. Any deficit in the fund is met by Exchequer subvention. Entitlement to social insurance benefits is conditional upon the claimants having a certain number of contributions paid or credited in a specific period of time. The contributions conditions vary according to the different insurance schemes.

Social insurance schemes comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Occupational Injuries Benefits, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit and Death Grants.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Social Assistance schemes are financed entirely by the Exchequer. One of the basic requirements to qualify for payment under the social assistance schemes is that the claimant must satisfy a means test.

Social Assistance schemes comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory) Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance, Blind Person's Pension and Rent Allowance.

CHILD BENEFIT

Child Benefit is funded entirely by the Exchequer; it is payable in respect of all children regardless of family means.

GLOSSARY

being paid.

CLAIM/CLAIMANT: An application/applicant for a social welfare payment.

SOCIAL INSURANCE PAYMENTS: These comprise Old Age (Contributory) Pension, Retirement

Pension, Widow's/Widower's (Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Contributory) Allowance, Deserted Wife's Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Disability Benefit, Occupational Injuries Benefits, Unemployment Benefit, Maternity Benefit, Health and Safety Benefit, Adoptive Benefit, Treatment Benefit and

Child Increase where both are in receipt of a social welfare

Death Grants.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS:

These comprise Old Age (Non-Contributory)

Pension, Widow's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Orphan's (Non-Contributory) Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's Allowance, One Parent Family Payment, Unemployment Assistance, Pre-Retirement Allowance, Supplementary Welfare Allowance, Family Income Supplement, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance,

VOLUNTARY & COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

The Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs' grant schemes concentrate on a wide range of support for local self-help groups, community development, welfare rights and information work, and on the provision of seed money to enable community groups to pilot initiatives identified as meeting new and emerging community needs. To be eligible for funding, groups must subscribe to a self-help, community ethos and must involve the intended beneficiaries in the management and the design of the project. These grant schemes are aimed at developing people and their capacity to participate in society, rather than at the provision of services or at the direct economic development or job creation initiatives.

ISLAND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

A programme of core funding to five off-shore islands, which is geared towards the specific needs of island communities, funded under the Community Development Programme.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE

The aim of a Family and Community Services Resource Centre is to help combat disadvantage by improving the functioning of the family unit. Centres can provide special services for lone parent families, young mothers and others considered in need of extra support and can act as a first step to community participation and social inclusion for the most vulnerable and marginalised families. Centres are also concerned with initiatives to enhance their parenting skills and initiatives to promote the greater involvement of young men in the life of the community.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The programme provides financial assistance to projects towards the staffing and equipping of local resource centres which provide a focal point for community development activities in the area and to other specialised community developed projects and initiatives having a strategic importance. The projects provide a range of supports, development opportunities and services to community groups and individuals within their areas.

MONEY ADVICE AND BUDGETING SERVICE

At the end of 1998, the Department's Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) supported 49 projects around the country which address the problems of moneylending and overindebtedness.

Appendix 5

FAMILY AFFAIRS UNIT

A new Family Affairs Unit was established in the Department of Social, Community and Family Affairs in 1998. The role of the unit is to co-ordinate family policy, pursue the findings of the Commission on the Family's final report following their consideration by the Government, to undertake research, and promote awareness about family issues.

The Unit has responsibility for a number of family services including the provision of grant aid to support activity in the areas of :-

- Marriage Counselling
- Marriage Preparation Courses
- Child Counselling in relation to parental separation
- Bereavement Counselling and Support on the death of a family member.

Voluntary organisations providing:-

- marriage counselling services helping people to deal with difficulties they experience in their relationships
- marriage preparation programmes
- counselling services to children whose lives have been affected by parental separation
- bereavement counselling and support to families on the death of a family member

may apply for funding towards the cost of these services.
