Converging themes

- Moore St & lanes part of a larger linked historic framework to include the new Cultural Quarter at Parnell Sq
- Moore St to constitute the link between Historic and Cultural quarters.
- Rejection of the proposed development as inappropriate and failing to reflect or respect the historic and cultural significance of the area
- Properly planned, the appropriate development of Moore St offers an opportunity for North City urban regeneration with cultural centres/spaces, small shops, enterprises, and residences
- Respecting and strengthening the Street Trading tradition and supporting its viability will complement the restoration of the area
- The appropriate restoration of Moore St and its environs can convey a profound sense of its historical place in 1916 – the Anne Frank House/Newgrange experience
- There is a critical importance to the entry points onto Moore St in capturing its history and significance
- The value of the streetscape being restored and capturing the scale of the casualties involved
- Buildings of significance beyond 14/17 should not be overlooked – including No 10 and also that at Moore Lane corner
- Kilmainham Gaol would have been lost but for the vision and commitment of voluntary groups. So too with Moore St – this initiative rests on the passion and concern of ordinary individuals to ensure that this historical place is preserved, restored and honoured.
