## Galway City Council - Waste Action Plan Submission

A Chara,

Galway City Council wish to re-enforce the following matters of concern as part of the consultation process in respect of the Waste Action Plan:

- Green Procurement as part of an award criteria for contract could be established with an initial target of 30% of local authority published tenders. The OGP and the LGOPC would nationally implement Green procurement within their frameworks and mini competitions.
- Implementation of an incentivised pay by weight charging scheme for waste collection.
- Potential for incentives for recycling processer start-ups within Ireland in order to reduce the climate impacts associated with travel of waste.
- Reduce the quantity of single use plastic placed on the market such as banning non-re-usable single use plastic(SUP) beverage containers and introduce a levy on items such as take away container and plastic bottles.
- Targeted Nationally driven awareness campaigns to be implemented.
- Consideration to be given to Construction & Demolition Waste currently being generated and identify any reusable items.
