PART II : SANITARY INFORMATION**1. Country of Origin**

- a. Ireland has a mandatory official national cattle identification and registration programme that permits traceability of cattle from birth to slaughter or death.
- b. Ireland is a Controlled Risk Country, regarding BSE, in accordance with OIE requirements.
- c. Ireland is free from the following contagious and infectious diseases in accordance with OIE information;
 - i. Foot and Mouth Disease
 - ii. Bluetongue
 - iii. Anthrax
 - iv. Bovine Brucellosis
 - v. Enzootic Bovine Leucosis
 - vi. Lumpy Skin Disease
 - vii. New World screwworm (NWS)
 - viii. Contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia (CBPP)
 - ix. Rinderpest (RP)
 - x. Rift Valley Fever (RVF)

2. The animals described above,

- a. Are identified by an individual tag, applied to both ears in accordance with the national cattle and identification programme.
- b. Have not been treated with natural or synthetic oestrogenic (excluding estrus synchronization), hormonal substances and thyrostatic preparations. The use of anabolic or hormonal growth promoters is forbidden for administration to ruminants, and this measure is applied in accordance with European Community legislation.
- c. Were not fed on fodder of animal origin, manufactured from protein processed from ruminant animals, excluding milk proteins. The use of mammalian protein (except from milk and milk products) is forbidden for feeding ruminants, and this measure is applied in compliance with European Community legislation.
- d. The animals and the feed they have been fed with, comply with the EU requirements laid down in the EC Decisions concerning protective measures with regards to contamination with dioxins and radioactivity.
- e. Originate from herds clinically free from Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis (IBR) and Paratuberculosis (Johnes Disease).
- f. Originate from officially Tuberculosis-free herds.
- g. Were vaccinated against Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis at least one week prior to scheduled departure.
- h. Were inspected during the 24 hours prior to scheduled departure and had not shown clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease, including skin disease.

i. Before departure, were treated for external and internal parasites :

j. Come from a holding of origin which is not subject to any prohibition or restriction for reasons of animal diseases affecting bovine animals and are not animals to be slaughtered under any disease control programme.
