Commission closed the case on 22 October 2015


- Agreed Road map of deliverables agreed to achieve compliance with the judgment.
- Included:
  - Policy: Ministerial Directives, recognition of enforcement as a core function;
  - Structural establishment of OEE, NTFSO, RMCEI, dedicated enforcement staffing, NIECE;
  - Financial / remedial specific sites, multiple LA areas - approx €120m by end 2016.

- WERLAS
  - Selection of WERLAs announced 9<sup>th</sup> October 2015.
  - The structures are to be put in place for an initial period of five years with a review as to its effectiveness carried out after year two.



### WERLA Functions


- Coordinating waste enforcement actions
- Setting priorities and common objectives for waste enforcement
- Ensuring consistent enforcement of waste legislation across the three existing waste management planning regions
- To develop a strong regional enforcement network through best practice and continuous professional learning
- To deal with strategic national waste enforcement priorities and serious criminal offenders;
- To drive improved levels of compliance and enforcement.
- Local Authority personnel as first responders on the ground to specific breaches of waste legislation
