### Amendments to the Packaging Directive

 Challenging Targets for Plastic Packaging recycling under the amendments to the Packaging Directive

Material	Current EU Recycling Target Performance (2017)		By 2030
Plastics	,	50%	55%

Mandatory EPR for Producers of Packaging from 2024



### Single Use Plastics Directive (2019/904)

- Consumption Reduction Measures (Article 4)
- Market Restrictions (bans) Article 5
- Product Requirements tethered caps and recycled content (Article 6)
- Marking Requirements (Article 7)
- Extended Producer Responsibility new obligations (Article 8)
- Separate Collection 77% by 2025 and 90% by 2029



# SUP Directive Q: What does it cover? A: SUP and Bioplastic versions of:

- Food Containers
- Cups for Beverages
- Cotton Bud Sticks
- Cutlery, plates, stirrers and straws
- Balloon Sticks
- Expanded polystyrene single use food and beverage containers
- All oxo-degradable plastic products
- Balloons
- Packets and Wrappers
- Beverage Containers up to 3ltrs in size
- Beverage Bottles up to 3ltrs in size
- Tobacco products containing plastic filters
- Wet wipes
- Sanitary towels
- Plastic carrier bags
- Fishing gear (including aquaculture gear)



#### SUP Directive – Article 4

Achieve an ambitious and sustained reduction in our use of SUP Food Containers and Cups for Beverages

By 3 July 2021 - prepare a description of the measures to be used in a MS, notify the Commission of the measures and make them publically available Measures can include:

- Setting national consumption reduction targets
- Ensuring re-usable alternatives are made available to consumers
- Economic instruments such as ensuring SUP items are not available free of charge
- Legally binding agreements between competent authorities and economic sectors
- Notifiable market restrictions
